ANOINTING OF THE SICK: By Appointment Only



This Sunday's liturgical year reminds us, not only of the end of the liturgical year, but also of the end of all things and of the preparations we need to make to reach Heaven. The main theme of the three readings is an invitation to live in such a way that we make the best use of the talents God has given us, so that at the hour of our death Our Lord will say: "Well done, my good and faithful servant!... Come and share the joy of your master" Matthew 25: 21.

The first reading suggests that we should be as diligent and industrious as a loyal and faithful wife, in the use of our God-given gifts and talents with "the fear of the Lord." Unlike the one-talent man, she takes her gifts and "brings forth good, not evil"; she "reaches her

hands to the poor and extends her arms to the needy," and she is a portrait of responsible readiness.

In the second reading, Paul advises us as "children of the Light" to "stay alert and sober," living in such a way that we will be ready when Jesus does come, and will encourage and build each other up as we wait for the "Day of the Lord."

Today's Gospel asks us if we are using our talents and gifts primarily to serve God and doing everything, we can to carry out God's will. The parable of the talents challenges us to do something positive, constructive and life-affirming with our talents here and now.

We need to trust God enough to make use of the gifts and abilities we have been given. We may be especially talented in teaching children or cooking meals or repairing homes or programming computers. So, we should ask ourselves how we are using our particular gifts in the service of our Christian community and the wider society.

All of us in the Church today have received at least one talent namely, the gift of Faith. Our responsibility is not just to preserve and "keep" the Faith, but to work with it. We need to promote and add value to Faith by living it out. The way to preserve the Faith, or any other talent that God has given us, is to put it to work and help it bear fruit.

This is what happened to my distant cousin from Chicago.

But you, brothers and sisters, are not in darkness, for that day to overtake you like a thief. For all of you are children of the light and children of the day. We are not of the night or of darkness. Therefore, let us not sleep as the rest do, but let us stay alert and sober.

GOSPEL Matthew 25:14-30 OR 25: 14-15, 19-21

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "A man going on a journey called in his servants and entrusted his possessions to them. To one he gave five talents; to another, two; to a third, one--to each according to his ability. Then he went away. [Immediately the one who received five talents went and traded with them, and made another five. Likewise, the one who received two made another two. But the man who received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and buried his master's money.]

"After a long time the master of those servants came back and settled accounts with them. The one who had received five talents came forward bringing the additional five. He said, 'Master, you gave me five talents. See, I have made five more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy.' [Then the one who had received two talents also came forward and said, 'Master, you gave me two talents. See, I have made two more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I

will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy.' Then the one who had received the one talent came forward and said, 'Master, I knew you were a demanding person, harvesting where you did not plant and gathering where you did not scatter; so out of fear I went off and buried your talent in the ground. Here it is back.' His master said to him in reply, 'You wicked, lazy servant! So you knew that I harvest where I did not plant and gather where I did not scatter? Should you not then have put my money in the bank so that I could have got it back with interest on my return? Now then! Take the talent from him and give it to the one with ten. For to everyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away. And throw this useless servant into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.'"]

PART TWO: THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE EUCHARIST

In last week's bulletin article we looked at how we come to an understanding of the significance of the Eucharist by looking at a passage from the Gospel of John, chapter 6. A passage that shows Jesus speaking literally to his followers about receiving the Eucharist. We also talked about how there are conflicting interpretations of this passage from other Christians which brought up questions on the original meaning of the passage itself. We concluded with a good guide for meaning can come from the Church Fathers.

So, who were the Church Fathers? Most of these men were living relatively close to the time Jesus lived. These people, often gathered together to clarify conflicting expressions of the Faith and sought to understand the intention of Jesus. For our purposes on the topic of the Eucharist, let's look at a passage from one of the fathers, St. Irenaeus we wrote the passage below in 130 A.D:

He has declared the cup, a part of creation, to be his own

blood, from which he causes our blood to flow; and the bread, a part of creation, he has established as his own body, from which he gives increase unto our bodies. When, therefore, the mixed cup [wine and water] and the baked bread receive the word of God and becomes the Eucharist, the body of Christ, and from these the substance of our flesh is increased and supported, how can they say that the flesh is not capable of receiving the gift of God, which is eternal life—flesh which is nourished by the body and blood of the Lord, and is in fact a member of him?"

This is only one Father, if you want multiple affirmations of the Eucharist by the Fathers, there are resources out there. I also want to point out that not only did the words of the Church Fathers affirm that the Eucharist was believed but their actions did as well. At the time, when Mass was celebrated we find the liturgy of the Eucharist.

Before I conclude, just an aside, the interpretation of John 6, affirms a literal interpretation of the text but that doesn't entail, every passage of scripture should be interpreted literally. We have to seek some wisdom to understand a book that at times is as complex as scripture. I also understand that there are more challenges to believing that the Eucharist is what we say it is. As people of a part of a Church that has witnessed and engaged over 2000 years of human history, the encouragement to you is to let the Church have a voice in speaking to those challenges. Do your research, ask questions about the meaning of Churchy words, come in talk to us. For those of you who have questions, my attitude towards you isn't one of condemnation, condescension, disappointment, or impatience. I believe we are all on a journey to greater understanding and one simply can't know all things about everything.

I pray that this helps you to grow closer to the Lord, makes the reality and dignity of the Mass more in accord with what it actually is, and affects you and in turn those around you. Blessings.

RCIA

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process of preparing the unbaptized, and those un-formed by Christianity (termed, uncatechized), for acceptance of Christ, of the Catholic Faith, and reception of the Sacraments of Initiation. Full initiation normally concludes with the Easter Vigil (the night before Easter Sunday). The process usually takes a year, although there may be exceptions, due to age or infirmity. **Catholic initiation** (outside of the R.C.I.A.) indicates that a person is already validly baptized, already accepts Christ, and now wishes to be a Roman Catholic. This catechesis (learning the Faith) can be adapted to the specific needs and circumstances of the individual.

REMINDERS FOR ATTENDING MASS DURING THE COVID 19

Please remember everyone attending Mass must wear a face mask. Those unable to wear a face mask throughout the entire liturgy, whether it be due to age (the CDC does not recommend those under the age of two to wear a mask), health condition, or preference, are asked to worship at home. The face mask should cover the nose and mouth. The pastor is not required to wear a face mask while celebrating Mass except for in procession and distributing Communion.

It is also important to maintain social distancing in the procession to Holy Communion. The tape on the floor indicates six feet distancing.
