


Rite of Christian **Initiation for Adults**

FROM YOUR SHEPHERD: PAX ET BONUM!



If you were in Boston or New York this past Thursday, I hope you went to Church to celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension. It is interesting to note that here at St. Francis Xavier, which is part of the Archdiocese of Washington, we celebrate Ascension this weekend. The feast replaces the 7th Sunday of Easter. It is not only our archdiocese that does not celebrate Ascension on the Thursday after the 6th Sunday of Easter. In fact, in our country, only the ecclesiastical provinces of Boston, Hartford, New York, Newark, Omaha, and Philadelphia have retained the celebration of Ascension on the proper Thursday. All the rest of the ecclesiastical provinces in United States, like Washington, have transferred the feast to Sunday. (Please note that an ecclesiastical province is composed of the archdiocese and its suffragan diocese, e.g. the Ecclesiastical province of Washington is composed of the Archdiocese of Washington and its suffragan diocese, the Diocese of St. Thomas).

Why do we celebrate Ascension on Thursday and why did most ecclesiastical provinces transfer it to Sunday? Traditionally, the whole church celebrates Ascension on Thursday because in the Scripture, Ascension occurs 40 days after Easter. Plus, there is also a significance of the number 10. Pentecost occurs 10 days after the Ascension.

However, Ascension is a Holy Day of Obligation, and it was observed that Mass attendance on that day, especially in the West and South, is low. It was also difficult for some priests who serve multiple parishes and needed to travel on a Thursday to celebrate Mass. Hence, in 1999, the ecclesiastical provinces in the United States were given permission to transfer the Solemnity of the Ascension from Thursday after the 6th Sunday of Easter to the 7th Sunday of Easter. The same principles were used when we transferred Epiphany from January 6 to the Sunday after January 1, and when we transferred the Solemnity of Corpus Christi from the Thursday after Trinity Sunday to the next Sunday.

Are we compromising too much? Where is the universality, one may ask? Can we still call ourselves One Church even though we celebrate Ascension this weekend while our brothers and



sisters in the other ecclesiastical provinces and in other countries celebrate it this past Thursday? I guess some of you might think that it does not really matter. But it really does!
