



## PUBLIC ARCHAEOLOGY PRESENTATION

# THE ARCHAEOLOGY OF NEWTOWNE'S ENSLAVED AFRICAN AMERICAN COMMUNITY

Archaeologists Aaron Levinthal and Sarah Janesko will share discoveries from the homes of the enslaved community who lived on the Jesuit's Newtowne Plantation between the late 17<sup>th</sup> century through the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century.

Archaeologists found thousands of artifacts associated with the home sites of enslaved African Americans. The refuse pits, filled with clay tobacco pipe stems, oyster shells, and even charred tobacco seeds, are revealing what life was like for a community who left few written records. The presentation will reflect on how the Jesuits used the landscape, including the locations of slave quarters, the types of crops grown, and the animals raised on the plantation. Some of the more interesting discoveries include a palisade found by remote sensing, and Native American pottery sherds suggesting close relationships and interactions among everyone living on Newtowne Neck.

#### FROM YOUR SHEPHERD: PAX ET BONUM!

Two Fridays ago, on June 24, the day when the Church celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade, ending the right to abortion, which was upheld for five decades. This was good news for our country and for our Church.

Cardinal Gregory says "Nearly 50 years ago when Roe v. Wade was handed down, our nation became a house divided against itself by putting freedom of choice before even the inalienable right of life itself. Since then, we have tirelessly prayed and worked for a restoration of the values stated in the Declaration of Independence that have made ours a truly great nation. Human life is precious and sacred."

Cardinal Gregory further adds "We rejoice in this latest step in our journey, but our work is not done. Locally and nationally, we still have more to do to advance the dignity of human life and to make sure that the full range of life issues are adequately addressed." I agree with Cardinal Gregory that our work is not done yet. I am happy that Roe v. Wade was overturned but I am not completely overjoyed because the law does not really affect abortion in our state of Maryland. Plus, I feel sad because the decision brought out a lot of bad comments and angry reactions from so many people. The goal is to unite our country and convert people's hearts. Instead, the opposite happened. Probably you will agree with me that the issue indeed polarized our country more. Furthermore, instead of understanding, mistrust occurred. There were even reports of vandalism and harassment.

Hence, even though Roe v. Wade was overturned, our work is just beginning. There are so many things that we still need to do. First, let us keep praying for the unborn children and all the victims of abortion. Second, let us pray for people who think that abortion is ok that they realize the sanctity of life from the moment of conception to natural death. Abortion will never be okay. We have the freedom to choose but this freedom is not authentic if it is not governed by right reason and conscience. Freedom also comes with responsibility. Richard Hays, a New Testament scholar, says "as God's creatures, we are stewards who bear life in trust. To terminate a pregnancy is not only to commit an act of violence but also to assume responsibility for destroying a work of God." Finally, just as we pray for an end of abortion, let us pray for mothers who are pregnant, pray for those who think that their freedoms are violated, and pray for our society that we promote a culture of life, a culture that protects the unborn, the children, the youth, the elderly, and the dying.
