






CELEBRATE FALL WITH OUR BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP!

From the Deacon's Desk

It's back to school time! For me it seems that summer has just flown by. Hopefully you had an opportunity to do something different or fun, even if it was just as simple as hanging out with family or friends. It's also time to get back into the swing of things here at church, too. Youth and Adult Faith Formation are getting ready to start. That's actually one of the things I love about our faith and the world we live in. There is always an opportunity to learn. No two people are the same, and no two people have the same experiences in life; however, the basic principles of how to live a good and fulfilling life are pretty straightforward. Putting that knowledge into practice, however, can be quite a challenge.

The Scriptures this weekend speak about humility. Humility frees us to maximize our God-given talents, because it frees us from being afraid of what other people will think. The history of art and music are full of examples of this. True artists work hard to develop their creative gifts, regardless of the praise or recognition of critics. Even many great works in the classical music repertoire, for example, were never even recognized until long after the composer's death. Bach's Mass in B Minor, a beautiful musical setting for the Mass, was not known to have been used or performed during his lifetime. Likewise, Bach's "Goldberg's Variations" only became successful a hundred years after his death. Beethoven had a similar experience. The modern piano was developed during his lifetime and his thirty-two piano sonatas became a staple of serious public piano performances. Unfortunately, only two of these were known to have been played in concert during his lifetime. Lucky for us, Bach and Beethoven focused their efforts on developing and exercising their talent, otherwise these works of art might never have come into existence.

All of us need use our God given gifts and talents. We might not compose music, but we are all uniquely gifted. We need to set aside time to grow in knowledge and wisdom, love and charity. Humility doesn't stifle the human spirit, but sets it free. (This is contrary to what our society often professes.) Even so, exercising humility does require a conscious choice on our part – a conscious choice to pray and reflect on God's word and discern how it applies to our life.

As a new school year begins, let us pray for a renewal in our own lives and in our community. Saint Catherine of Sienna, pray for us, that we might in humility, persevere in prayer and grow in faith!
