




November is traditionally the month in which the Church remembers Her dead, and in a special way we are invited to remember our family and friends who have died,

The cost is about \$15 to \$20 per box plus \$9 per box for shipping. The Knights supply the boxes, collect them, and transport them to collection sites in mid November.






FROM YOUR SHEPHERD: PAX ET BONUM!

One of our parishioners approached me and asked if we can promote a certain book about preparing to consecrate oneself to Jesus through our Blessed Mother. Although this book that she showed me was well-received by several people (based on reviews from Amazon.com) and was even endorsed by two bishops, after reading a few pages, I am not sure if this is a great book to prepare for Marian Consecration.

Marian consecration is a popular name for Total Consecration to Jesus Through Mary. When I consecrated myself to Jesus through Mary, I was still in the seminary. I mentioned my desire to my spiritual director a year after I entered the seminary, but he told me that I was not ready yet. Then, on my fifth year of formation, when I was getting ready to be ordained as a deacon, I mentioned this desire again to my spiritual director and he did not see any problems anymore. In fact, during the preparation, it was I who realized my unreadiness. Hence, instead of consecrating myself to Jesus through Mary on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (December 8, 2014), I delayed my consecration until the Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Mother. It was on February 2, 2015 when I consecrated myself to Jesus through Mary.

The Second Vatican Council tells us that everyone should have a genuine devotion to Mary and entrust one's life to her motherly care. One way to develop our love for our Blessed Mother is through Total Consecration. I am going to renew my consecration again on December 8 and preparation will begin on November 5.

So what is Total Consecration? This column is not enough for me to explain what it is, how to do it and what will happen to a person who has done consecration. If you want to know what it is, or how to do it, I recommend Fr. Michael Gaitley's 33 Days to Morning Glory. Meanwhile, if you have done your consecration and would like to renew it, I recommend True Devotion to Mary by St. Louis De Montfort (Catholic Publishing Edition). Let me know if you are interested by emailing me. I can even offer weekly meetings to supplement your preparation.

I hope you will consider this devotion of consecration. After all, St. John Paul II's motto *Totus Tuus* (Totally Yours) is inspired by the teaching of St. Louis de Montfort in his *True Devotion to Mary*: "I am all yours, all that I have is yours, O Most loving Jesus, through Mary, your most holy Mother."
