

Dear Friends in the Lord,

Today's Gospel reading is John's account of the miracle of the Multiplication of the Loaves and Fishes. (John 6:1-15) It is also the first of five consecutive Sunday Gospel passages which will take us through the 6<sup>th</sup> Chapter of John's Gospel – the "Bread of Life" chapter.

As you know, John's account of the Last Supper does not include the Institution of the Eucharist. Rather, it includes Jesus washing the feet of the disciples. A few years ago, in his Holy Thursday homily, Msgr. Tinsley pointed out – as insightfully as always – that John's Gospel does not include the words of institution themselves but, in the washing of the feet, we are presented with the consequence of those words.

This is why, I am sure, that this is one of the few miracles or events that is recounted by all four Gospel writers. It was clearly important to the first Christian communities both because of the assurance of Jesus' real presence in the Eucharist and what that real presence means for an authentic witness of Christian discipleship. The importance of this miracle has certainly continued throughout the centuries. When I was concluding my sabbatical with the New York Catholic Worker community (not yet aware of what a blessing I was given in being assigned to St. John's!) the members gave me a beautiful and treasured gift. It is a calligraphed quote from Dorothy – which still hangs in my office:

What we do is very little, but it is like the little boy with a few loaves and fishes. Christ took that little and increased it.

*He will do the rest.* 

What we do is so little we may seem to be constantly failing. But so did He fail. He met with apparent failure on the Cross.

But unless the seed fall into the earth and die, there is no harvest.

And why must we see results? Our work is to sow. Another generation will be reaping the harvest.

Dorothy – who did not want to be called a Saint – knew how little she did. Yet – because she is a Saint – did not allow that truth to discourage her. Like her, we need to humbly recognize how little that we do in the face of the world's problems and divisions. And, like her, we cannot allow that truth to dissuade us from the responsibility of Christian discipleship. It is true that we don't have enough. But God does. If we share what little we have, *He will do the rest*.
