

Dear Friends in the Lord,

Today, the Sixth Sunday of Easter, moves us closer to the end of the Easter Season. In these last two weeks, which includes Ascension Thursday, we are called to prepare for the promised gift of the Holy Spirit. It is at this time that Jesus tells the apostles, and us, the shocking truth – it is better for you that I go! (John 16:7). They had a difficult time seeing this truth. As do we. Still, we can come to see that it is good news because it shows that our true home is heaven. For in his return to the Father, which we celebrate on the Feast of the Ascension, Jesus does not abandon us but is our hope. In recognizing that heaven is our true home, we prepare ourselves to "be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit." Sheila Cassidy reminds us how this gift can inform the way that we live here on earth:

If we can come to want only what God wants, then we are in a curious way untouchable; for the loss of property, of good name, or health, or even of life holds no fear, for if that is what God wants, we will be at peace.

This week's Catholic Free Press contains the clergy assignment changes which will take place on July 11st. Typically, I just pay attention to whether my name is on the list. Now, I also check whether Fr. Sebastian's name is there. Thankfully, neither one is! However, there is one name on the list – Fr. Jim Mazzone – that I wanted to mention for a few reasons. First, he has served for many years as the diocesan Director of Vocations. It is not an easy job. Yet, Fr. Jim worked with passion and creativity. His success, the product of the Holy Spirit, must be considered exemplary. Second, throughout those years Fr. Jim has been a great help to us here at St. John's. The fact that I have so quickly removed his name from the list of Assisting Priests on the front of the bulletin should not obscure this fact. Fr. Jim was always ready to help and did so, in whatever way needed whenever his schedule allowed. Fr. Jim loves St. John's. Worcester. Indeed, he directed his annual Partners in Charity gift and this year's Legacy of Hope donation to us here on Temple Street. Finally, he is becoming the Pastor of St. John's in Clinton. This pleases me completely. I love Fr. Jim and I love the people of Clinton. I am thrilled for them all. Thanks, "Mazoulo," and we pray that you will receive many blessings in the "best town by a dam site."
