

Dear Friends in the Lord,

There is no doubt that many of you remember November 27, 2011. It was the First Sunday of Advent. It was the day we began using the new translation of the Mass parts. The responses, the Gloria, the Creed, the Eucharistic Prayer and other parts of the Liturgy that I have not yet been able to memorize. My siblings have always been invaluable in helping me to see what the laity is thinking and experiencing at Mass and in the Church. On the afternoon of November 27, 2011 my brother Jude called and told me that at Mass that morning he thought to himself – "If they changed the Our Father, I'm leaving!" While reflecting on this week's gospel passage, Luke's presentation of the Lord's Prayer, I was reminded of his declaration. So, it was with a heavy heart and great regret that I called Jude this week to tell him that Pope Francis is changing the translation of the Our Father.

In June it was announced that, after Vatican officials had been studying translations for sixteen years, Pope Francis was changing the translation of the Lord's Prayer. The officials decided that a mistake had occurred in the current translation "from a theological, pastoral and stylistic viewpoint." As a result, the Holy Father approved changing the phrase "lead us not into temptation" to "do not let us fall into temptation." As with absolutely everything in the world today, this decision has been met with tremendous disagreement.

Quite near the top of the list of things that I know little about is the Greek language, so I am not able to hold an educated position on that part of the debate. Yet, the Holy Father commented, "I am the one who falls; it is not him pushing me into temptation to then see how I fallen. A father doesn't do that, a father helps you to get up immediately. It's Satan that leads us into temptation, that's his department." I strongly agree with the Pope's reasoning. This rings very true to me. The truth that has become clear to me over the years is that God is not the problem, we are. There is no doubt that temptation and testing come into every life. The falling and failing that is, too often, part of that reality is my fault, not God's!

This translation change will have the power to bring a change in our image of God as Father. A change for the better, particularly in our relationship with God and our openness to the Father's abundant grace so freely offered to his children.

Upon hearing what the change actually is, Jude decided that he would stay with us. Me, too – even if I may never be able to memorize the Our Father again.
