

Dear Friends in the Lord,

Recently, we lost two distinguished members of our parish. Most everyone must know that Brian O'Connell passed away a week ago Friday. He was a member of the Worcester School Committee for 36 years and of St. John's all his life. Brian was baptized here on May 29, 1949. We celebrated his Funeral Mass on this past Thursday. On this coming Wednesday we will celebrate the Funeral Mass of Anne Leseman. She came to us in 2008 when we merged with St. Casimir's. Many of you would know her as the Cantor for the Responsorial Psalm at the Lithuanian Masses. Anna was 103. I told her that she was most likely the oldest cantor in the Universal Church! Brian and Anna were very different personalities, with very different histories and contributed to St. John's or St. Casimir's, the City of Worcester or the United States in very different ways. Still, they could not have been more alike in the depth of their faith. They were united, too, in that it was this faith that informed their lives. We will, of course, miss them both. Yet, they leave us a tremendous example of Christ-like living. In following their example, we are assured of seeing them again.

This week I received a Thank You letter from the Grace, Mary, Kat and Ann at the Central Mass Housing Alliance for our participation in the Hope for Housing Program that they administer. The wonderful people at CMHA do wonderful things for people in need. One of the qualities I like best is that CMHA celebrates victories. We know that in life there are plenty of defeats, especially when engaged with seemingly intractable problems like homelessness. It's important to celebrate the victories. They passed on three stories of how our participation in HFH won the day. Here's one:

Thomas and Jean have three children ages 13, 14 and 15. They are a hard-working couple both working full time and able to pay their monthly bills and provide for their children.

This was until there was an accident.

Thomas had a terrible accident which has left him with a severe back injury. Due to the extended absence from work, he was dismissed from his job. Jean continues to work full time, but with the loss of income the family fell behind in their rent by \$677.00. They were faced with possible eviction. Thomas and Jean were directed to CMHA Housing Counseling. Working together with their counselor they were able to use HFH funds to stop the eviction and to save their housing subsidy.

Many thanks to the members of our HFH team. Thanks to all those who support the program regularly and generously. If you are interested in joining HFH so we can expand to more of the weekend Masses, please contact the rectory.
