

Dear Friends in the Lord,

There must be a Kansas City Chiefs' fan or two among us. They will be easy to identify since I am sure they will be sporting the team gear! Still, the Super Bowl did not play out the way many of us had hoped. Fortunately, though, Souper Bowl Sunday was a tremendous success. Thanks to all of you we received donations to our Food for the Poor totaling \$2,540.00. Thanks to the religious education students and to the other volunteers who assisted. Finally, special thanks to Dan and Deb Donovan who - for over twenty years now! - organized the program for us. One source tells me that this is the most we have ever raised. Thanks to everyone - even the Chiefs' fans.

Recently, we received the first parish installment from the Legacy of Hope campaign. Upon the advice of the parish council, we opened a savings account in the Diocesan Expansion Fund dedicated to the Legacy of Hope. In this way, we will be better able to track the money we gained through that diocesan capital campaign. The initial installment was \$50,034.16. We then withdrew \$31,489.47 to pay New England Power and Sound for the new sound system. On Monday, thanks to an initiative from the parish council, an energy audit will be conducted at all our buildings. As you may recall, the parish case for the campaign also included capital improvements. I am no contractor, but I must believe that the space between the doors at the front of the church is not energy efficient. Therefore, I believe the audit will help point out the improvements we can make. The parish council is also working on an updated parish census and a survey. Gathering this information will be helpful in putting a plan together. St. John's, as we all know, is an exemplary Christian community. We are planning on growing the gifts we have received. The council will be meeting on March 3rd at 7 p.m. in the rectory. All are welcome.

You know that Jimmy and I like to include various people in the prayers for the deceased. You may know, too, that I am a Celtic fan and a sinner. However, I am not big enough of either one to have consciously excluded Kobe Bryant from our prayers last week. A couple of people pointed out the oversight, I am sure many more noticed it. I apologize for the oversight. It is important, of course, to pray for the dead. I think, especially, for the young and for those who die tragically. At the morning prayer at the Xavier Center during last week, we did remember Kobe and his daughter, Gianna. Which reminded us to pray for all those who have lost a loved one, especially those taken too soon and tragically. Which, in turn, deepens our belief expressed by St. Paul in Romans 8, 18: "I consider that the sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed in us."
