

Dear Friends in the Lord,

As you read this bulletin. I am in Pittsburgh. In fact, if you are reading it at the Sunday night 7:15 p.m. Mass, I am in Heinz Field awaiting the Steelers game against the Seattle Seahawks. Clearly, I am a glutton for punishment. Whenever I am away from Temple Street, I miss St. John's and Worcester – at least a little bit. This time it is more than a little, though. The Superintendent of Schools, Maureen Binienda – who has done so much for Worcester and our children – was kind enough to invite me to offer the Benediction at the dedication of the new South High School's Brian A. O'Connell Memorial Auditorium. As many of you know, Brian was a life-long member of St. John's. An active, dedicated and strong supporter of our parish and its mission. He also served on the School Committee for over thirty years. I regret not being able to attend this event. Brian's wonderful combination of a superior intellect and sincere kindness was a gift to the parish and the city. We all miss him. My prayer is that this memorial will help us at St. John's and the City to remain committed to creating a thoughtful and caring community.

Another important event this Sunday is the 10:00 a.m. Mass at St. Paul Cathedral which Bishop McManus is celebrating to mark the opening of the Diocesan Phase of the XVI Synod of Bishops. That Synod will meet in Rome next year to consider the topic: For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission. The Mass begins our prayer that the Holy Spirit guide us in providing input to the Synod and to pray for the Bishops who will gather in 2022-3. Bishop McManus writes:

Pope Francis recognizes that synodality is an integral part of the form, style and structure of the Church. He has asked the faithful of every diocese to reflect upon their experience of consultative processes in the Church as part of our mission of journeying together to deepen and spread the faith in our lives and our world.

The Bishop goes on to say that this Synodal consultation will provide a buttress to our efforts to get people back to Mass so that we can deepen and spread the faith in all our parishes and in the diocese.

Finally, this weekend's passage recounts one of the most iconic exchanges in the Gospels. James and John ask Jesus that they may sit "one on your right and the other on your left" in heaven. The demand that they state at the beginning of the encounter is the give-away: "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask you." The Lord indulges them – "What do you wish me to do for you? – so to teach them: "The cup that I drink, you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized you will be baptized..." Having been made in the image and likeness of God, we continue to try and make God into our image. Thankfully we will not succeed.
