

Dear Friends in the Lord,

Today's Gospel passage has passed over two chapters in Mark. Last week, Jesus was leaving Jericho. This week, Jesus is teaching in the temple in Jerusalem. A "scribe" approaches him and asks which is the greatest commandment. Since there are 613, it is not a surprise that this question is a persistent concern of the scribes. In the face of so many commandments there was a need to prioritize; to follow a guiding principle. The same is true for us, of course. As Monika Hellwig reflected: *All of us feel that tension sometimes between the complexity and multiplicity of demands made on us and the need for a single guiding principle to cope with it all.* 

This familiar exchange is recounted by Matthew and Luke, as well. However, the Pharisee in the former and the scholar of the law in the latter both ask in order to test Jesus. The scribe in Mark, much like the man who previously asked what must be done to inherit eternal life, is genuinely interested in what Jesus thinks. On the one hand, the answer Jesus offers is not too different from what others present. In Ponder, Mahri informs us: Jesus was not the first teacher to connect these two great commandments. For example, the first century –CE Rabbi Hillel said "That which is hateful to you, do not do to others, this is the whole Torah, and the rest is commentary, go learn it." On the other hand, simply by who he is, fully divine and fully human, his teaching carries a power with it like no other. Jesus himself says, *The first is this*. Then, *The* second is this. Still, coming from him, the commandment is truly one. Jesus' teaching does not allow for a nebulous call to love and serve God, without any content to it, nor a vacuous definition of a good moral person without any reference to the divine mandate.

Keeping the Great Commandment remains as challenging today as it was in first century Jerusalem, of course. Further, there are distinct challenges presented to us in this, our time. The one which stands out to me is the contemporary notion that I cannot love my neighbor until I first love myself. I no longer remember (much of anything) who said that "every problem in life has a psychological cause and a spiritual solution," but they were correct. In responding to the scribe who, like us and so many people, came to him seeking meaning and purpose in this world and eternal life in the next, Jesus' teaching is psychologically sound and spiritually profound. He alone would know that the love of God, neighbor and self is one love – the greatest love.
