

Dear Friends in the Lord.

Today is the Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. We will not celebrate another Sunday in Ordinary Time until June 18th. The reason being, of course, that this week we begin the Season of Lent with Ash Wednesday. On which, we will have Masses with the distribution of ashes at both 12:15 and 6:15 p.m.

In all candor, I am not a big fan that for many the focus of Ash Wednesday is limited to the ashes themselves. As one of my closest advisors likes to point out, at the Mass we hear the Gospel passage from Matthew in which Jesus instructs us "not to perform righteous deeds (almsgiving, prayer and fasting) in order that people may see them." Then the very next thing that we do is receive a mark on our forehead which announces to all who see us that we have begun forty days of performing righteous deeds. It opens us to the charge of "being like the hypocrites" which Jesus expressly asks us to avoid.

Conversely, then, I am a huge fan of the Season of Lent. For it is when we wash the ashes off our foreheads that the real work begins. We are not hypocrites, but we are sinners. We know that we are all in need of conversion. One of the significant blessings of the forty days, is that we undertake the penance together. An annual blessing for us at St. John's – for 100 years now – is the Novena of Grace in honor of St. Francis Xavier. Each year, at least part of March 4th to 12th, and usually all nine days, are in Lent. This year, not only is that true, but this includes two weekends which only increases the communal aspect of the season for us.

It is important to note, too, that one of the most critical elements of a fruitful Lent is the time leading up to Ash Wednesday. We certainly want to hit the ground running. Indeed, we have always consider the time of preparation a necessary aspect of the season, as well. Similarly, what our teenagers and their families, our younger children and their families are doing now in Confirmation and First Eucharist classes will help to determine the fruitfulness of their celebration of the Sacraments themselves.

To that end, these past weeks of Ordinary Time has provided us with terrific preparation. The Sermon on the Mount, especially Jesus' six antithesis statements that we have heard the past two Sundays, remind us of the challenge that following Christ entails: turn the other cheek as well; love your enemies; be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect.

This is going to take me more than forty days.

Voluntary Self-Denial may include, in addition to fasting, participation in daily Mass, spiritual studies, Lenten Devotions, Stations of the Cross, saying the Rosary, deeds of mercy and kindness. Easter Duty Obligation must be made from the first Sunday in Lent (Feb 26) through Trinity Sunday (June 4).
