

Our sincerest congratulations to each of them and to their parents and family. Our deepest thanks to their wonderful teacher Donna Mastrovito, as well as Carole Cronin and Leonila Prunier for their assistance and to Srs. Carol and Janet for putting together the reception following the Mass.

Providentially, the Gospel passage is The Appearance on the Road to Emmaus from Luke 24:13-35. It is known as the "Gospel paradigm" for the Mass. The event takes place "That very day, the first day of the week," that is to say, it is Resurrection Day, Sunday. We are told that the "two of Jesus' disciples" were "conversing about all the things that had occurred" and were "looking downcast." Every one of us, at one time or another, has entered the church in a similar fashion, with fear and anxiety. Like these two disciples we listen to the Scriptures. Then hear them broken open in a homily (though not one so intimately connected with the Word as this one!). Most importantly, as we gather, we then experience the four vital actions of Jesus that were performed at the Last Supper, at the house in Emmaus, here with these beautiful children for the first time and across the globe every day: he took the bread, said the blessing, broke it and gave it to them.

Having recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread, the disciples changed direction and headed to the holy city. Their experience, and ours, is that the Eucharist is more powerful than any fear or anxiety we experience. Indeed, it is more powerful than the evil which is so active in the world today. To that end, the "Satancon" convention will be held in Boston from April 28-30 at the Boston Marriott Copley Place. The organizers of this convention are billing it as "the largest satanic gathering in history." As we gather at the table of the Lord, let us pray that it will be a failure.

At the end of Mass we are told to "go forth" to love and serve the Lord. We are sent forth to live out the reality of what we have just experienced and proclaim it to others. The very word Mass comes from the Latin word, *missa*, which is where we also get the word mission.
