

Dear Friends in the Lord,

This is how today's Gospel passage begins:

Jesus said to his disciples: 'Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me.' John 14:1

It was the same passage for the daily Mass on Friday and at the Funeral Mass on Friday. Taking place in the Upper Room, it is a critical text. Jesus has washed the feet of the disciples. Judas has left to do what he is to do. And it was *night*. The denial of Peter has been foretold. Then comes the above passage. It is the beginning of what has been named "The Last Supper Discourse." I do not think that name quite captures the moment. All of us have been part of an important family meeting. Something critical is about to happen, so everyone needs to come together to be alerted and to prepare for what is to come. This is what best describes that particular gathering of Jesus and his intimates. He did not gather them in order to present a paper on the socio-political culture of 1st century Palestine. Jesus' intention was to reassure and to encourage them to face both the immediate and future challenges.

The context in which we hear his reassurance and encouragement makes all the difference. At the funeral mass on Friday, looking out at the wife, son, daughter, grandchildren, siblings and friends of a 59 year old man who had passed after a year-long battle with that insidious disease of cancer, it seemed at that moment the words – *Do not let your hearts be troubled* - might ring a bit hollow.

Today's passage includes an additional six verses from both Friday's and the Funeral Mass selection. Hearing it at the celebration of the Fifth Sunday of Easter makes a difference, too. As the Lord's exhortation continues his words offer the encouragement and confidence we yearn for:

Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes in me will do the works that I do,

And will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father.

The passage concludes with just a hint of the promise we will prepare for and celebrate in these final days of the Easter season. The promise being, of course, the gift of the Holy Spirit. On a week from Thursday, we will celebrate the Ascension of the Lord. Followed by the Novena to the Holy Spirit leading to Pentecost. Opening ourselves to the grace which leads us to accomplish the works of God with hearts untroubled.
