

Dear Friends in the Lord,

Happy Mother's Day! As you know, I have been proposing that this holiday be celebrated in the Catholic Church on September 8, the Feast of the Birth of Mary. The proposal is going nowhere, so I am focusing on the fact that at least the secular world celebrates it during the month of May. We have not lost all our influence on the larger society. I find it significant that we began the month with our Lithuanian community crowning Mary and that we will end the month with our Filipino community doing the same. The significance deepens, too, since the last Sunday is Pentecost. We need Mary's intercession always, of course, and I have to believe that in the final days of the Easter Season she will be particularly helpful.

My sister. Nora recently told me that the best thing on Instagram these days is Paws for Prayer with Rooney on our parish page (or is it called a feed?). She went on to comment on what a great job our "Instagram peeps" are doing. I agree. As you know, we went on Instagram for evangelization reasons. Specifically, to attract as many of our new and younger neighbors to our community and mission. I am continually impressed with the variety and depth of the content. To that end, I encourage all of you to follow stjohnsworcester on Instagram. Better still, to encourage your children, grandchildren and every young person you know to follow us, as well. They will be entertained and enriched.

For instance, this week a short piece by Bishop Barron called "4 Ways to Grow the Church" was posted. Originally published at the Bishop's website Word on Fire.org, it was reprinted by Worcester West, a newsletter published by Parish Neighbors. Each of the four ways are simple enough on their face: Bring Another Family to Mass, Pray for the Expansion of the Church, Invite Seekers to Raise their Ouestions and Be Kind! In discussing the 4 Ways at Monday's Parish Council meeting, we agreed on the need to be intentional and consistent in implementing these practices.

The post was further inspired by the documentary, *Pope An*swers, covering Pope Francis sitting down with a group of 20-somethings and answering their honest and sometimes controversial questions. He does so in his typically straightforward and nonjudgmental way. A key moment was when one of the young people commented: "I think people are disappointed with the Church and not with God." The Holy Father replied: "When there is no testimony the Church becomes rusty. It becomes a club of nice people who do their religious duties but lack the courage to get out to the suburbs. We all like to be comfortable." (This was translated from Spanish so when he says suburbs it has a different connotation than what we mean here in the US) Pope Francis echoes his predecessor in today's passage from 1 Peter: Always be ready to give and explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope. (3:15)

When doing so, Be Kind. Who knows, maybe Mother's Day will moved to September and Father's Day to March 19<sup>th</sup>.
