

Dear Friends in the Lord.

Over the past several years, the Office of Vocations has approached us about taking a seminarian intern for the summer. However, I had resisted agreeing to do so. Frankly, I did not believe that there was a seminarian old enough for the assignment. Nevertheless, Fr. Donato Infante, the Director of Vocations persisted. I am thankful that he did. Zachary Sullivan began this week as our Seminarian Intern for the next eight weeks. Zack just completed his second year at St. John's Seminary in Brighton. He will be ordained a Deacon, God willing, next spring. Best of all, he is from Clinton. Which is to say that he is a terrific young man, devout, personable and hard-working. You will all get a chance to meet Zack in the days and weeks ahead and experience for yourself what I mean.

Thank you for all your prayers for Fr. Conrad. There has been some good signs and hopeful news regarding his condition this week. Still, his condition remains serious. Please keep praying for him. This week, I added the intercession of St. Philip Neri, his Feast Day was Friday, to the cause.

At the 4:15 p.m. Mass on Saturday, our Filipino community's The Lord of Pardon Prayer Group will celebrate its Anniversary. The celebration will include the Crowning of the Blessed Virgin Mary and we will conclude the Prayers of the Faithful with an Act of Consecration of the World to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. After the Mass, we will pray the Rosary as we process through the neighborhood. Finally, we will gather in the St. Francis Xavier Center for dinner. We will need the nourishment after all the activities. I am most grateful to the Filipinos for organizing the celebration. It is another positive sign that the post pandemic new normal includes gathering together to pray and celebrate.

Finally, of course, we conclude the Easter Season with the Solemnity of Pentecost. Throughout the Novena to the Holy Spirit, passages from the 17th chapter of the Gospel of John has stood out as particularly helpful. The chapter, which we heard from last Sunday, is referred to as the High Priest Prayer of Jesus. In the prayer, Jesus prays for himself, and for his disciples gathered with him in the Upper Room. Finally, he prays for us who follow him through the witness of the first disciples. His prayer is that the love with which the Father loved him may be in us and that he be in us, as well. This is the Holy Spirit. The love of the Father and the Son given to us, and it is magnificent to behold.
