

Last week, we said good bye to our Seminarian Intern, Zack Sullivan. This week, we say good bye to our Intern from Assumption University, Anna Murphy. I and we will miss them both.

I and we were blessed by their presence and ministry with and for us this summer.

Zack will be returning to St. John's Seminary in Brighton. He is on course to be ordained a Deacon at the end of this coming academic year. I have no doubt that he will be ready and will be a great Deacon. Extending that out a year, I have no doubt that he will be a great Priest. He has the heart and the mind for ministry, is curious and always seeking to learn. Plus, he quoted Dorothy Day in his farewell message. He scored big points for that move.

Anna will soon begin her Junior at Assumption. She is deeply involved with their Campus Ministry programs. Still, we hope that Anna will be able to find her way back to Temple Street. Her service at the Xavier Center, with our children and on communion calls was greatly appreciated.

Additionally, they worked well together—assisting, supporting and complementing each other. It was fun to observe.

I am sure that you will continue to pray for them as they continue on the path to ministry in the Church. Providentially, today's readings provide the framework for our prayers for them, for us and for all disciples. In the first reading from I Kings, we hear the familiar story of the call of Elijah. Often, God's call does not come like a strong wind or an earthquake or a fire. Rather, God is revealed in a *tiny whispering sound*. The world is loud, God is quiet. We pray that Zack and Anna and all of us remain attentive to the tender invitation to follow.

This especially important when life feels like we are *being* tossed about by the waves. We need to pray that in those times we are able to hear Jesus speaking to us: *Take courage, it is; do not be afraid.*
