

Welcome to another school year! Boy did the summer fly by. It is always way too short for me. Never enough days to sit on the beach and marvel at the beauty of the ocean. As my brother-in-law always says, "Time flies like the wind, but fruit flies like bananas."

The schedules for both Religious Education and First Reconciliation/Eucharist are on the parish website. Regular Rel Ed classes start September 17; grades 1-6 at 9 am, grades 7-9 at 11:15 am. As always, there is the option of home study for your children. Pflaum Gospel Weeklies has a digital format for their program, and it is the same as what we use in the classroom. If you want this option, register your child as usual, and email me that you want the home study. First Reconciliation starts in January, taught by Donna Mastrovito. Thank God for Donna! She's done this for over 30 years, and her students are very well prepared to receive Jesus for the first time at Mass. Confirmation class begins October 4, starting with 6:15 pm Mass and then with lessons until 8 pm. Please make sure to fill out the Confirmation registration form online, not the Religious Education form. And with First Communion, you need to fill out both forms.

We always welcome volunteers; in fact we love them! There are many ways to help out: teaching, classroom aide, hospitality, door monitor, special events, even office work. If you feel God calling you to any of these, please let me know. You may email me at dhgustowski@gmail.com or leave a message at the rectory.

I have often said, when I am physically unable to help out with something, "Well, I'll just have to pray for them" as if prayer is a last resort. Prayer is always our FIRST resort. The most important thing we can do is pray. So, if you like to pray (and who doesn't!) please join our new Rel Ed Prayer Team. The current plan is to commit to daily prayer for our students, families, teachers, and benefactors, then a monthly rosary after daily Mass where we pray for each child by name. Just drop me a message and I will give you more information.

I am beginning my 11th year of Religious Ed Coordinator here at St. John's. Unbelievable! I cannot thank Fr. Madden enough for this incredible blessing. And the words just don't exist for me to express the gratitude I have for you, the People of St. John's, for allowing me to help teach the Catholic faith to your children. It is an absolute blessing, and a privilege, to share my love of the Catholic faith with all of you. May God bless you all in abundance, today and always.
