

In the Gospel today, we hear the Parable of the Tenants. It is the second of the three that we will hear as Jesus responds to the chief priests and elders who have questioned his authority. Jesus does not answer their question directly. He hardly, if ever does. Nonetheless, though Jesus does not answer their question about the origin of his authority (they would not have accepted his direct answer), he does make clear the consequence of not abiding by his authority. The main point of the parable, which is voiced by Jesus himself in Mark's Gospel, but, as we hear, in Matthew the leaders condemn themselves is: *He will put those wretched men to a wretched death*.

Obviously, we do well to learn and remember this important lesson. Still, I cannot help but marvel at and praise the Owner of the Vineyard for his forbearance and patience. We are willing to give someone a second chance. Some might go even further, but most of us agree three strikes and you're out. Not Him, without rancor, chance after chance are given. The clear truth is that the Owner does not wish a wretched end for any of His tenants.
