

Dear Friends in the Lord,

You may know that our friend and former associate Pastor, Fr Sebastian is now the Pastor of St. Richard's in Sterling. You will not be surprised to know that he is doing a great job and the people love him. I know this because I recently participated in the All Souls Novena held at St. Richard's. The day that I chose to preach happened to be the one focused on Hell. Fr. Sebastian offered me the chance to choose another day. However, I felt that the passages from Matthew's Gospel over these last several weeks have instructed us on the nature and danger of Hell. This instruction continues today.

As we have learned over the years, the parables of Jesus have several levels to them. Often enough, as with today's Parable of the Ten Virgins, the superficial level is off putting. Jesus reveals to us that God is Father (Abba) who is kind and merciful, slow to anger and rich in compassion. Not a Lord, like the one in the parable, who will not opened the locked door as He claims not to know us. Jesus teaches us that whatever we do for the least among us we do for him. Yet, the so-called "wise" virgins refuse to help the others in their need, but they freely enter the wedding banquet. This does not make sense. There is a good reason for this. This is not what the parable is about. Rather, the parable is about what we do with the invitation extended to us all to take our place in the kingdom of God.

Gerhard Lohfink points out that the role of the torchbearing friends of the bride should not be underestimated. They were of signal importance for the feast. If they all arrived with burnt out torches it would be a profound humiliation for the bride and the village gossip about it would go on for years. Then in fact "the light would have gone out." We simply cannot imagine nowadays how quickly a bride's honor would be damaged in that time and place...A bridal procession without torches – our parable simply presumes – would have been a catastrophe. The wise bridesmaids who refused to share really saved the feast.

In Matthew, Jesus exhorts: *I tell you, unless your right-eousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven. (Mt. 5:20)* The Lord is kind and merciful, slow to anger and rich in compassion, but we must respond to that love, share that love or it will dry up and disappear. More than that, still, we must be vigilant and ready, because there is a lot at stake – the eternal banquet in heaven
