

Dear Friends in the Lord.

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year. Many thanks to the many people that made our Christmas joyful and meaningful.

Our Christmas giveaway party was a lot of fun. We had more boots. coats, hats, gloves, scarves, socks, toiletries and children's toys than ever before. We are grateful for all who donated and those who came to assist with the giveaway. We ranged in age from 6 to over 60 and all were a great help. Finally, it is always the gratitude of our friends who come to celebrate with us that resonates most deeply. Our liturgies, beginning with the Fourth Sunday of Advent and, of course, the Masses on Christmas, were precious. The big crowds are great. We could all benefit from spending more time in church. Given that hope is increased as our numbers rise, let's keep encouraging family and friends to join us more regularly. After all, it is the people that make the difference. To that end, our deepest thanks go to Dolores and her team who, with only a couple of hours to work with, created a beautifully decorated sanctuary which deepened our worship. Likewise to Eddy and the music ministers who, along with the liturgical ministers raised us up.

You may recall that at the beginning of Advent I shared a reflection from Eric Clayton which a friend had sent me from Jesuit.org. It was extensive. In fact, someone commented, "I enjoyed the encyclical." As we prepare to begin a new year and contemplate our resolutions, the same friend sent me another reflection from Clayton, the Deputy Director of Communications for the Jesuit Conference of Canada and the United States. Like the previous one – and his job title – it is long and helpful. So, I signed up for the weekly reflection. Still, I will edit his essay:

There's a phrase in the Ignatian tradition that flies under the radar: agere contra. It doesn't get quite the same amount of press time as magis or contemplatives in action or discernment or people for others. But it's an essential spiritual practice, one that Ignatius himself writes about in the Spiritual Exercises.

Quite simply, it means to act against. Ignatius invites us to identify those points of vulnerability in our spiritual lives – patterns of behavior, bad habits, personal insecurities or doubts – to name them, and then to, in short, overcompensate in order to strengthen them. For example, if we find ourselves constantly falling asleep during our time of prayer, Ignatius recommend that we double our prayer period and do so standing up.

We act against that which prevents us from encountering the joy and delight God desires to shower upon us. We act against those pernicious tendencies through which the enemy of our human nature might sow seeds of darkness.

As we continue our journey through Christmas and the New Year. what might we consider acting against in our own spiritual life? What simple, ordinary ways might we choose to train this spiritual muscle? And how might God be trying to shower us with joy and delight as a result?
