

This week, as I was speaking with one of the regular volunteers at our weekday morning meal, he told me that he had no idea how moved he would be by participating in the mission. I am regularly amazed both at the amount of food that is offered and the amount of joy our team experiences in preparing, cooking and serving the food. I am certain that this joy will be increased this week. First, because the Holy Cross students from the Community Based Learning program will be returning for another semester. Second, because we were approached by the Culinary Arts program at Worcester Tech and they will be coming, as well. The Director indicated that the initiative came from the students who wanted to find a way to serve the community. They sure found a way and both our guests and team will be deeply blessed by their presence.
