

Dear Friends in the Lord,

The Novena of Grace has been referred to as the Annual Lenten Retreat of the Diocese of Worcester. It is an accurate description. This year was, as always, a wonderful and spiritual experience. I thank all of you who, along with many of our friends from around the area, made the retreat. We owe special thanks to Dolores and the liturgical ministers, Eddie and the Cantors, Bobby and the collectors for their efforts that allow the nine days to proceed seamlessly. I mentioned on the last day that it is bittersweet when the Novena comes to an end. Fortunately, we have another retreat just ahead of us. Next weekend we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion and the beginning of Holy Week; which I have referred to it – every year – as the Annual Retreat of the Universal Church. My parents were very devout (my mother still is!) and we always went to church on the Triduum. It probably had to do with being in church on a Thursday and Friday, but it struck me how special and important time it was and is. I found it, then and still, particularly amazing that Christians all over the world – including young children with their families – gather to celebrate the great mystery of our salvation, even on a Thursday and a Friday!

Our Holy Week schedule is:

March 23/24 – Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion – regular weekend schedule.

Tuesday, March 26 – Mass of Holy Chrism – St. Paul's Cathedral 10:30 a.m.

Holy Thursday, March 28 – Mass of the Lord's Supper – 7:15 p.m.

Good Friday, March 29 – Downtown Way of the Cross – leaving St. John's at 12 noon

Commemoration of the Lord's Passion – 7:15 p.m. Holy Saturday, March 30 – The Easter Vigil – 7:30 p.m. (There is not a 4:15 p.m. Mass on Holy Saturday) Easter Sunday, March 31 – 8 and 10:15 a.m., 12:15 and 7:15 p.m.

This weekend is special, too, as they all are. The 10:15 a.m. Mass is the Sending Mass for the Confirmation Class. We are sending them to St. Paul's Cathedral on Sunday, April 7 to be confirmed by Bishop McManus. I have met with almost all of them – just three more need to be scheduled – and they are a terrific group of young people. To a person, they say that they are more ready and willing to be confirmed now than when they started the year. I think that is a good sign.

Then at the 12:15 p.m. Mass we will celebrate the Third and final Scrutiny with the five parish members who will be fully initiated into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. Deacon Ed and I agree that this has been an outstanding group. They have been serious and committed throughout the process. One of them even became a father for the first time recently.

Voluntary Self-Denial may include, in addition to fasting, participation in daily Mass, spiritual studies, Lenten Devotions, Stations of the Cross, saying the Rosary, deeds of mercy and kindness. Easter Duty Obligation must be made from the first Sunday in Lent (Feb 26) through Trinity Sunday (May 26).
