

We welcome two guests this weekend, one is a familiar friend and the other a new friend:

My thanks to Fr. Steve Gemme for returning to St. John's and filling in for me at the 10:15 and 12:15 Masses. I know everyone always enjoys Fr. Steve and he enjoys being at St. John's. Blessings to you, my brother, especially in your important work at St. Vincent's Hospital.

Our new friend is Jacob King. He has travelled from Maine to represent the Hallow app. As you know, we at St. John's have entered into a partnership with Hallow, the number one Christian prayer app on the internet. To date, over 80 people are in our community group on Hallow. Jacob is going to speak after communion at the Sunday Masses and then assist those who would like to join Hallow. He will speak more in depth in the church hall after the 12:15 Mass. He will offer assistance to us who will be participating as a community in the Lent Pray 40 Challenge beginning on Ash Wednesday, March 5. In addition, we will have access to other prayer challenges throughout the year. Welcome Jacob and thanks for your help.

Since we are always seeking to grow closer to the Lord, Lent is always well timed. This is also why the Mass readings leading up to Ash Wednesday are always helpful in our preparation for the penitential season. This is especially true this year as we hear passages from Luke's Sermon on the Plain. I suspect like many of you, I have grown increasingly frustrated with our elected officials – all of them. For too many years now, Washington has been more like a boxing ring than the seat of government. The primary focus has been on revenge and retaliation rather than leading and governing. This is true of both political parties. It is not a good situation. It does need to change.

Those of us who believe that Jesus Christ is the way and the truth and the life are uniquely called be this change that is so desperately needed. Today's Gospel passage is clear about this call:

Do to others as you would have them do to you. For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do the same. If you lend money to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners and get the same amount back. But rather, love your enemies and do good to them...

Jesus is right. His teaching is not easy, but it is the way to the truth and to life.
