

The Rosary is prayed each weekday **beginning** with the Angelus at 5:50 p.m.

Dear Friends in the Lord,

I have come to set the earth on fire and how I wish it was blazing!

Do you think I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division.

These words from Jesus in today's Gospel passage are not what we usually hear from him. Therefore, they can be more than a bit shocking to us. We prefer to tend toward his more familiar and comfortable sayings:

Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom.

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to vou. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid.

We know that there is no duplicity in him so these sayings cannot conflict with one another. Then, what is the explanation? The first thing that helps is to remember the context. Today's Gospel verses follow immediately last week's Gospel passage. In it, as you remember, Jesus calls his followers to not be anxious or afraid, but to gird our loins, light our lamps and be vigilant as we await the Masters return. Then concludes:

Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more.

The Scripture scholars help us in pointing out that fire purifies. The verse today reminds us that Jesus brings the purifying fire of judgement to his preaching. We know that this message meets even to this day with acceptance and rejection and is a source of conflict and dissension even within families. What becomes clear to the Lord is that this reality will be the source of not only his own suffering and death, but that of any who will follow him faithfully. It is critical that we recognize that this dissension and subsequent suffering is not intentional on his part, but the tragic consequence of a fallen world which he obediently accepts as he fulfills the Father's will. Then and still, offers every grace we need to be faithful, as well..

These consequences are being experienced all over the world today. Most notably, in Ukraine and Gaza. Less notably, but as horribly, in Sudan, Syria, Myanmar, the Sahel Region, Democratic Republic of Congo, Haiti, Nagorno-Karabakh and Yemen, as well. Not to mention the challenges in our own nation, city and homes. We know that with the gift of faith we have been entrusted with more. We know this means we are required to share the redemptive power of Jesus' sacrificial and purifying love.

We, too, wish it would blaze now. Yet, we know the mission is not easy. Often we feel as though we have done so little and even have failed. Still, we are sure that God is more powerful than Satan – which means that mercy trumps vengeance, light overcome darkness, love is more powerful than hate – so we can carry on humbly and hopefully.
