

Dear Friends in the Lord,

Every year summer seems to get shorter and shorter. No matter how much I plan, I simply cannot spend enough time on the beach. Very sad. However, it means that I am closer to seeing all of our students in Religious Education classes. I do miss them. September 21 starts year 13 for me. I don't remember getting old; do you? Does anyone? Serving the wonderful people of St. John's has been the greatest blessing and privilege so far in my life. I cannot thank you enough for allowing me to run your Religious Education Program. I pray that I'm healthy to do so for another 13 years or longer.

Registration for grades 1-9, Confirmation, and First Reconciliation/First Eucharist is up and running on our parish website, stjohnsworcester.org. Click on the Religious Education tab, and scroll down to the program you want to register your child in. You should get an email confirmation that the registration was completed. I will check and make sure that is happening. Grades 1-9 start on Sunday, September 21 at 9 AM in the church hall. Parents are requested to come to the St. Francis Xavier Center for orientation once you've dropped your child off. Light refreshments will be served. Confirmation begins Tuesday, October 7 with Mass at 6:15 PM in the chapel, followed by class until 8 PM in the church hall. Parents are required to stay for this first class for orientation. Again, light refreshments will be served.

It has been delightful and hopeful to see an increase in the number of altar servers here at St. John's. Once a child has received First Eucharist, he or she is eligible to serve on the altar. They do not have to attend our classes to be eligible. Just let me know, and we will train them. And Dolores is always there steering them in the right direction. We are also looking for junior lectors to read at our 10:15 AM Sunday Mass, or any Mass for that matter. Again, just let me know and we will provide the training.

It is most providential that the canonizations of Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati, who died at age 15 and 24 respectively, have been scheduled for September by Pope Leo XIV. I am so excited to share their message with our kids. We are all called to be saints. To become a saint means we have made it to Heaven, our true home. We are no different from Carlo or Pier Giorgio, or any of the greats that came before us. All we need to do is say yes to God, over and over and over again.
