

Dear Friends in the Lord,

Though I would not have worded it as such, I completely understand Mayor Jacob Frey's reaction to the horrific tragedy which occurred at Minneapolis' Annunciation Catholic School on Wednesday: Don't say this is about 'thoughts and prayers' right now – these kids were literally praying. It was the first week of school – they were in church. The terrible frequency of these mass shootings is such that most of us struggle with becoming desensitized and completely frustrated. Mayor Frey appears to be at the latter place. Understandably. I cannot say that I know what is in the mayor's heart, nor the hearts of those who invoke thoughts and prayers for people who suffer unspeakable horror. Still, I think his frustration can point us toward a fruitful response.

This is critically needed in our present situation, especially as it is displayed in light of the too frequent mass shootings. Once again, this week we hear from one extreme that declares that this is a mental health problem; and from the other extreme that declares this is a gun control problem. The clear truth is that it is both and, yet nothing is done to better address either problem. What is truly needed, of course, are *thoughts and prayers* — only those that lead us to an increased care for those who battle mental illness, that create safer places for our children and respect for those with whom we disagree. I know that we have longed for, indeed, prayed for these outcomes. Perhaps, the fact that *these kids were literally praying...they were in church* will spur greater action from us all.

This week, we are happy to welcome Silangely "Angie" Perez as our parish secretary. She will be working from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. from Monday through Friday. This will allow Jimmy to focus both on the bookkeeping for the parish and the Food for the Poor, as well as assist his father with the bookkeeping at many other parishes in the diocese. His Dad and I hope that it will also allow him to get back into the coaching that he was so successful with and enjoyed so much.

Angie has been in a couple days this week so that Jimmy could show her the different parts of what is a unique job in a unique place. Fortunately, that did not scare her away. We are grateful to Angie for joining us. I have assured her that she is now a part of an extraordinary group of Christians and will be blessed as she blesses us. Please offer her your thoughts and prayers.
