

Dear Friends in the Lord,

This week I received my first Social Security check. It has forced me to face two facts: I am getting old, and I have not had a financially successful life. Both of which help to motivate me not to turn into a grumpy old man. A tough task for us all, young and old, in these difficult days. Whether things have never been worse or not, they certainly are bad. So it is providential that as we gather this weekend we are invited to celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. Other religions find a certain redemptive value in suffering and, for some, in death, as well. Though their interpretations differ significantly.

In Judaism, our elder brothers and sisters can view suffering as a test from God that builds character and fosters spiritual growth. We are very familiar with the "Suffering Servant" songs in Isaiah, sometimes interpreted as representing the people of Israel, whose suffering help brings redemption to humanity. In Islam, trials and hardships are seen as tests from Allah, intended to strengthen one's faith and patience. In Hinduism, suffering is seen as a natural, though not permanent, part of the cycle of existence. Accepting it with patience and detachment helps the soul evolve and move closer to liberation from the cycle of rebirth. In Buddhism, suffering is seen as a noble truth that can lead to enlightenment. It focuses on the compassionate alleviation of suffering, both for oneself and others.

Christianity, particularly Catholicism, sees "redemptive suffering" rooted in the passion of Jesus Christ, as a central doctrine and fundamental feature of our theology and spirituality. The gift that this revelation is, also comes, as all gifts do, with a responsibility. We have a central role in witnessing to the transformative power that suffering and, even, death possess. A few years ago, when I was wrongly but publicly accused of bad things, I was uplifted by your support and that of many others. I remain deeply grateful. At that time, I was given a prayer titled "Learning Christ," which remains a part of my daily prayers. This week it occurred to me that I should pray for us all since it reads, in part:

Teach me to profit by the suffering that comes across my path. Let me so use it that it may mellow me, not harden or embitter me, that it may make me patient not irritable, that it may make me broad in my forgiveness, not narrow, haughty and overbearing.
