

Dear Friends in the Lord,

Although I picked up my 2026 appointment book a few weeks ago, I have not yet decided on the quote for its cover. There are several that I am considering. The quote of the day that I received on Friday from Pax Christi was from Albert Schweitzer: *The awareness that we are all human beings together has become lost in war and politics*. It is in the running for 2026. I think Schweitzer is correct. The awareness that we are all human beings together has been lost to a significant degree in our day. Certainly, war and politics have been major contributors to this loss.

Still, there is more to it than that. Something more fundamental like original sin and the human condition. One of the most frustrating aspects of our mission at the St. Francis Xavier Center is the awareness that we are all in this together has been diminished, if not lost, yet. I swear that you cannot leave your cellphone unattended for any length of time, or it will disappear. This happens no matter what political affiliation one claims.

The awareness that we are all human beings together is being lost because of concupiscence, what St. Augustine saw as the disordered desires, thoughts and inclinations that rise from humanity's fallen state. This fear prevents us from seeing each other as God's gift to each other, but, rather, as enemies and competitors. The Catholic Church is better positioned than any other institution to address this lack of awareness. Indeed, we have been commissioned to do so.

Our Book Club's selection for this month, *Listening Together* by Timothy Cardinal Radcliffe, the English Dominican has been a great help in exploring how we can fulfill this mission in our own lives and ministry. Allow me to quote from the back cover *Radcliffe's reflections encourage readers to think about conflicting hopes, different visions of the Church as home, the need for unity, friendship, and above all, the importance of listening, discernment and mission as a means for this synodal journey to continue to succeed.*

He uses the Transfiguration as the event which guides our listening together. The Cardinal suggests that on the mountain beauty, goodness and truth interacted as forms of authority. What was particularly striking to me was that in the section on Goodness, His Eminence focused on courage. How beautiful and true that the goodness necessary today to rediscover the awareness that we are all human beings together requires courage.
