

Envision a world of justice, charity and dignity for all. The 2020 patron for the Partners in Charity Appeal in the Diocese of Worcester sought such a world in his country. Archbishop Oscar Romero, the martyr of El Salvador, died for such a vision. Now a saint, Oscar Romero stands as an example of a man who lived among his people and served them, fueled by the love of God and complete trust in Jesus Christ.

Reflecting on the 2020 appeal, Bishop McManus recalled the ad limina meeting he and other New England bishops had with Pope Francis. "Our Holy Father reminded us that we must be close to those in need, as Christ was close to his people. This call to accompany our brothers and sisters is the heart of our mission as Catholics in the Diocese of Worcester," Bishop McManus said. It is the mission work of Partners in Charity.

There is no doubt that St. Oscar Romero was close to his people. He lived in a country in turmoil and injustice, murder and torture, yet he held fast to the promises of Christ. He tried to imbue those promises into

the lives of those people he served as they sought justice and dignity. He gave them hope and a path to follow while there was chaos around them: "Let us not tire of preaching love; it is the

force that will overcome the world."

He also challenged them into action.

Faith in Action has been a constant theme of Partners in Charity.

A Prayer in Time of Pandemic


O God,




