

St. Agatha Parish is a Christian Community of Catholics from Milton, Quincy and beyond, whose Mission is to demonstrate Love by:


- proclaiming and celebrating God's Presence on earth;

A Note from Our Pastor,

As a prelude to my column this week, just a reminder about 5 items. First, I hope you can be present (and invite others to join you) for Tom Peterson's presentation Tuesday evening from 7 to 8:15pm in the Upper Church on "Our World Needs Catholic Heroes." One of our St. Agatha parishioners has generously funded Tom's evening with us, so I hope we'll have a full Church for this inspirational talk on a very timely topic. Second, the next night Wednesday from 6 to 8:30pm at Veterans' Memorial Stadium in Quincy there will be *A Night 4 Life* with inspiring speakers, music, and Eucharistic Adoration. At the time of my writing this column it is too early to tell if we have enough requests for our parish to hire a bus, but an announcement to this effect will be made at this weekend's Masses. Third, the deadline is approaching for families to register their children for our upcoming Vacation Bible School to be held here from July 15th to 19th. In addition to the children who will enter grades 1–6 in the fall who will enroll, we are looking for students in grades 7–12 to serve as Counselors and Group Leaders. Fourth, if you are a lector or extraordinary minister of Holy Communion here and have not yet filled out a CORI form here or in another entity of the Archdiocese of Boston, please be sure to do so and submit it (with a MA license as ID) before or after Mass this weekend. Fifth, Happy Fathers' Day to all fathers, grandfathers, godfathers and all those who exercise a fatherly role in their loved ones' lives!

Last weekend at our 10:30 Pentecost Sunday Mass Amalia Halpin who became a baptized and confirmed Catholic at our Easter Vigil this past April and who is completing her Junior year at Milton High School spoke about her conversion experience. Because parishioners at the 10:30 Mass were so inspired by what Amalia had to say, I asked Amalia's permission to include the text of her remarks in my column this week, and she happily agreed.

"Good morning, St. Agatha Parish, my name is Amalia Halpin and today I am here to share with you in the presence of the Lord my Catholic conversion story. As I stand here a (fairly) newly baptized and confirmed member of the Church, I would like to thank every single member of this parish, who has made this community a second family, and this building a second home.

If you would have asked me 3 or 4 years ago about my relationship with God, I would have straight-faced said that I was an atheist. My mother and father, though both baptized Catholic, decided not to baptize my sister and me. They wanted to allow their children to choose their own path, and develop their own relationship with the God they chose. But like any young kid, growing up I felt left out. Every week, I heard my peers talk about what they had done in CCD, and CCD turned into youth group, and youth group to confirmation class, and even though not everyone was excited to go to something their parents may have "encouraged them" to do, I wanted to know what life as a Catholic was like.

It was not until January 2018 that I really began to question my relationship with religion. I had spent 8 days in intensive care, leaving my life in the hands of doctors and nurses at Children's Hospital. There were days when they would knock me out for the whole day, and nights when I saw staircases to another place, yet not my mother who was right beside me.

While plenty of people can see the multiple opportunities for an epiphany, I made a sick joke of it all; it was comical to me. But, it wasn't the night my blood pressure dropped, it wasn't seeing all my friends going by on an imaginary staircase, it wasn't the doctor telling me I might lose my leg; no, instead it was a simple comment by one of my nurses that made me realize, "Oh man, this is bad." I had all sorts of drugs and other fun things in me, but I still remember the look of mild fear, and "Honey, would you like to see a priest?" Yikes!

But I made it out of that one, and my entire life had fallen apart. I couldn't walk or move around; I couldn't stay a full day at school; I couldn't even stay awake for more than 12 hours. But there was one thing I could do: Go to Church.

Yes indeed, atheist Amalia had promised her mom that if she survived this one, she would go to Church once a month, for 6 months. It was easy enough; I sat through it; I left before Communion was to be received.

But as the months wore on, it occurred to me that I was given a new lease on life, a chance to start from 0, because after such an experience, you don't know if your life is going to be cut short. For a while I did everything, for better or for worse, but through the good and the bad, I kept attending St. Agatha's on Sundays, often on my own. In silence, I would sit in the back pews, and study every word of the readings. It started to make sense: the words of the Gospels were no longer stories, but instead ways to live my life. I understood the message; I heard my calling. So, in August of 2018 I approached Fr. Palardy (knowing remarkably little about who he was) and asked him about RCIA here at St. Agatha's.

I enjoyed every second of my RCIA experience, from studying the words of prayers most people can rattle off without a second thought, to investigating the history of the Church, and I began to feel my relationship with Christ deepen. The lessons given to me by the RCIA team, the stories of their own relationship with the Lord, all made me realize that though I, like others, may not have thought I have a place in the parish, but there is always room.

Receiving the Mercy of the Lord in my life, as it was intended to be, has given me a new purpose; it has given me a community; it has given me a new spark in my life and love in my heart that no one would have expected from the angry little kid that I was. So, my brothers and sister, I leave you with this: pray for those contemplating bringing Christ into their lives, and spread the love and community that Christ created, just as this parish was able to love me. God bless all of you and your families, and thank you for your time and everything you have done."

THE WEEKLY UPDATE

Although not yet visible from Adams St. or the parking lot, the masonry project has in fact begun. Out of consideration for the many events which occur during June, the contractor agreed to delay putting up scaffolding around the tower until the end of June. However, they have begun on the Ellsworth Rd. side of the Church and on the Courtyard side (outside the Chapel) by doing work that can either be done from the ground or with their hydraulic aerial lift. Just as a reminder, this is a six month project which will be completed in late October or early November. The total cost of the project will be \$600,000, with \$250,000 being paid from our Capital Reserve Account and the remainder being covered by a loan from the Archdiocese of \$350,000 at 3.75% per annum. This loan will incur monthly payments of \$3,502 per month beginning this month. The Finance Council is exploring alternative income streams that could accelerate the repayment of the loan, thereby saving the parish a portion of the considerable cost of interest on the loan.

In addition to the Offertory total below, \$4,340 was contributed to the Special Collection for the Support of the Seminaries. Thank you for your support.

The Sacred Pause

Last week, I took in the awe-inspiring sight of the sun dancing like a billion diamonds off of Lake Tahoe with the backdrop of the majestic Sierra Nevada mountains! Who couldn't see the Divine Artist's handiwork in such beauty! **"Creation is the footprint of God"** proclaims St. Bonaventure.

Often we forget to **connect the living realities present at our Mass with our daily walk of life.** Our Psalm today, ponders God's creation which immediately leads the psalmist to rejoice in his own great dignity! **God cares for us!**

"When I behold your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars which you set in place — What is man that you should be mindful of him, or the son of man that you should care for him?" Psalm 8

On Sunday we profess that God is the **"Maker of heaven and earth."** Let the words of Genesis echo in our ears. "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" (Gen 1:1) and "he saw that it was good." This summer as we **carve out restorative periods of rest** by the shore or in the mountains, or by a pool, recall such truths as:

- **God is the origin of all things;**
- In creation we see **God's "footprints"** so we can discover his magnificence and love;
- Life springs forth, the world exists, because all things obey the divine Word—**God is still active and always creative;**
- **We, you and I, are the summit of all creation;**
- We—the human person—are the only being in God's entire creation who are **"able to know and love his creator"**
- God desires to fill us with love and **God knows us personally and invites us to greatness.**

A paraphrase of today's Psalm 8 might read: *"Who are you that God is mindful of you and cares for you with an everlasting love."* You are God's beloved! Enjoy your summer and take time to worship God who holds you in the "palm of his hand."
