


MISSION STATEMENT


St. Agatha Parish is a Christian Community of Catholics from Milton, Quincy and beyond, whose Mission is to demonstrate Love by:

A Note from Our Pastor,

You will notice in this bulletin the request for folks to share the treasure of our Catholic faith with young people from our parish. We need YOU to teach or co-teach a grade level in our Faith Formation Program for: Grade 1 on Wednesday or Thursday, Grade 2 on Tuesday or Wednesday, or Grades 3 on Tuesday or Thursday. Beth Peterson and Jenn Caputo will provide you all the materials and help get you up and running, and will support you throughout the year.

Please do give these opportunities some thought and prayer, because YOU ARE NEEDED!

The first evening session of our Scripture study on the Biblical Explanation of the Mass is this coming Tuesday the 16th from 7 to 8pm in the Gathering Space. All are most welcome. The morning session will begin two weeks later on July 30th.

If you haven't had the opportunity yet to help support our high school teens on their upcoming service trip to Appalachia (West Virginia this year), please donate through our Go-Fund-Me page or mail a check to the parish with ASP on the envelope. More details below in this bulletin.

This coming Thursday the 18th from 7 to 8:30pm in the Gathering Space there will be plenty of fun and games for high school teens at another Thursday Night Drop-In.

Feel free to join our pick-up choir at the 11am Sunday Mass. The choir rehearses just prior to Mass, at 10:20. All are welcome, and no strings attached!

In our Liturgical Calendar this week, on Monday we remember St. Bonaventure, one of the early Franciscans who was a Scripture scholar, a spiritual writer of much depth, and also Minister General of all the Franciscans for 17 years and also Cardinal Bishop of Albano in Italy. He and the Dominican St. Thomas Aquinas died the same year 1274. Both are doctors of the Church because of their great wisdom. Aquinas is known as the Angelic Doctor and Bonaventure as the Seraphic Doctor.

On Tuesday we celebrate the Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Mount Carmel is the place in Galilee where the O.T. prophet Elijah defended the Israelite faith in the one true God, and it is also the location where the original community of the Order of Carmelites was established in the early 13th century, with our Lady as their patroness. From that community have come a number of very popular saints—including 3 St. Theresas, and also communities of men and women, several of which are here in Massachusetts, including the Carmelite Sisters in Roxbury, and the Sisters who staff Marian Manor in South Boston and St. Patrick's Manor in Framingham.

On Thursday we remember the priest St. Camillus from 16th-17th-century Italy who early on suffered from what we'd call today a gambling addiction, but after his conversion to Christ he founded a religious community called the Camillians (and, no, they didn't change their colors frequently—those would be chameleons!!!). Through this community St. Camillus reached out to the sick and established several hospitals.

On Saturday we honor St. Apollinaris who lived in the late first and early second century in northern Italy. He was a fervent and courageous missionary and bishop who was tireless in his ministry and renowned for the power of healing with which the Lord endowed him. He was severely persecuted for his faith in Christ and for his zealous leadership of the Christian community in Ravenna. St. Apollinaris is celebrated for being an early Christian martyr.

Gospel : Luke 10:25-37

There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test Jesus and said,

Jesus said to him, “What is written in the law?

How do you read it?”

He said in reply,

*“You shall love the Lord, your God,
with all your heart,
with all your being,
with all your strength,
and with all your mind,
and your neighbor as yourself.”*

He replied to him, “You have answered correctly; do this and you will live.”

But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, “And who is my neighbor?”

Pastoral Planning

July 14 ~ Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

“... heed the voice of the LORD, your God, and keep his commandments and statutes...,” Moses reminds us that the commandments are readily accessible. In fact, he goes on to say they are “already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out.” Simply put—Love God, love your neighbor. Jesus presents that message in the familiar story of the Good Samaritan—a story with a universal message of love, mercy and kindness. The challenge is real. We need to trust that by God’s grace, we already have what we need to carry out his command.

THE WEEKLY UPDATE

As mentioned in recent Operations Notes, an area of financial concern for the Parish is the Weekly Offertory. Because of the early print deadline for last week’s bulletin the Weekly Offertory total for June 29-30—the last weekend of Fiscal 2019 was not available. So below you will see the last two weekends’ totals which show the ending status of FY 2019 and the first week of Fiscal 2020. Since we fell short of last year’s target, the Finance Council approved an adjustment to the annual budget for the Weekly Offertory for this fiscal year down to \$650,000 from \$675,000. We have made a much better start this fiscal year than the last two years. The In-pew collection of \$9,898 for the first week of the current year outpaced both the FY 19 (\$8,882) and FY 18 (\$8,489) opening weekends by a wide margin. So hopefully this trend will continue throughout the summer months.

Also please be aware that the two week process of erecting the scaffolding for the major portion of the masonry restoration project was begun last week. We are hopeful that all the Church entrances will be fully accessible throughout the project, but during certain heavy weekday work periods it may be necessary to temporarily restrict access to certain doors. Thank you for your patience and understanding.
