August 25 ~ Twenty-first Sunday of Ordinary Time

Isaiah is speaking on behalf of the Lord, directly to us: "...proclaim my glory among the nations." This might seem like too much of a challenge. Take a few minutes to ask God to whom should you be proclaiming God's glory? Is it a family member, a co-worker or a friend? Tell YOUR story of the importance of Jesus in your life. And, in case we think that task is for someone else, the Church in her wisdom reminds each one of us in today's psalm refrain: "Go out to all the world and tell the good news!"

THE WEEKLY UPDATE

It's been a very busy summer around the Church and School. The key activity in the Church obviously has been the masonry project has been moving along rapidly and is ahead of schedule. In the school we have been working steadily to get the building ship-shape for the opening day of school on September 4th and we're almost there. We've stripped and waxed all of the floors in the classrooms, hallways, stairways and cafeteria, and have done a major cleaning of all of the restrooms. The gymnasium floor will be re-finished this week. A great school Spirit developed last year, the credit for which goes to new Principal Nancy Carr and the members of the Family School Association who coordinated many special events throughout the school year and even in the Summer. Last Friday night they sponsored an outdoor movie (the new Dumbo film) in the parking lot behind the school and have planned an "80's Night" to be held at the Sons of Italy on Quarry St. in Quincy on September 6th at 7 PM. It promises to be a great evening of fun and all are welcome. Tickets are \$35 which includes dinner and a full night of music and dancing. Enrollment news is also good. The School will be adding an additional K-0 program for 3 year olds which will be supported by a grant from the Lynch Foundation. We are also blessed to actually have more children enrolled in our Middle School than we had last year, which is somewhat uncommon in a Catholic elementary school. So all indications are that this is going to be a great year for St. Agatha School. If you or someone you know is looking for a high quality Catholic education for their child(ren), applications for enrollment are still being accepted for all grades.

In addition to the Weekly Offertory amount below, \$2,390 was contributed on the Feast of the Assumption. Thank you for your support.

The end of summer is fast approaching. Many have been traveling weekends; please know, we have truly missed you!! Summer has brought to our parish new folks regularly attending our Masses and several families who have recently registered. Allow me to extend our warmest welcome! Please introduce yourself to our priests, to Deacon Dan, to me, or to those in your pew.

Summertime is a very special time—it is a string of moments in our otherwise very busy and hectic year where we consciously seek quiet. It is a restorative time for oneself and one's family. **Summer rest helps us to piece together once again the many fragments of our busy lives.** Rest, relaxation, a change of scenery, and plenty of outdoor activity renew our strength and offer moments of reflection, times of praise, and generous opportunities for gratitude. **Summertime can be, in a sense, an extended sabbath for our body and soul.** Sabbath rest reminds us for Whom we are created, the great things God has in store for us, and to that which we are called—eternal life.

Abraham Joshua Heschel, a Jewish theologian and philosopher wrote, *"Six days a week we wrestle with the world, wringing profit from the earth; on the Sabbath we especially care for the seed of eternity planted in the soul. The world has our hands, but our soul belongs to Someone Else."*

For Christians, this weekly Sabbath is Sunday, which the early Christians called the Lord's Day. By keeping Sunday for God:

- We keep first things first and put God above other things,
- We experience greater order and more peace in our lives.
- We pause, give thanks to God for everything we have—all we have is gifts freely given by a loving God.
- We are nourished by the Word of God and the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ.
- We discover the Sabbath is paramount to finding strength for the week ahead.
- We gaze into eternity.

As we get ready to settle back into our routines which Fall brings, **how might we**, for our physical, emotional, and spiritual health, **keep a spark of the sabbath spirit alive in our daily routine?** And most importantly, how might we resolve this Fall to observe the Lord's Day with greater solemnity **focusing on our two most important relationships: God and family?**

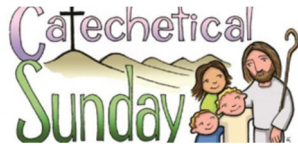
A Spirituality Group for Those In Recovery or Who Support Those in Recovery

Faith Formation Sessions for grades 1-6 begin on September 24-25-26 at 3:45 in the upper Church. Parents/guardians please accompany your child/children to the opening session.

If you know of a child entering grade 1 in September, please invite them to register for Faith Formation which starts in grade 1. Sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion, is a two-year process, usually in Grades 1 & 2.

We need your help as catechists to share Jesus' Good News with the children in grades 1 – 6 of our parish. Sessions are held once a week on either Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday afternoons from 4:00 to 5:00 pm, from September 17 to April 16. If the weekly commitment does not work for your schedule, share the class and co-teach with another volunteer. We supply the lesson plan, materials, support and class sizes are capped at 8 students per catechist.



Hall monitors are needed on all days! Hall monitors are stationed on each level of the school during session time to monitor and assure a safe environment for the children while attending Faith Formation.

Marriage: Call one of the parish priests or deacon. Arrangements are ordinarily to be made at least 6 months before the proposed marriage.

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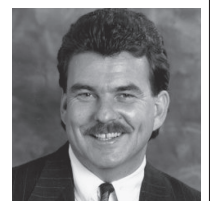


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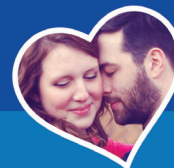


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
