

A Note from Our Pastor,

A month and a half ago many of us gathered in our beautiful Church building to embark on the Season of Lent with ashes on our foreheads. Those ashes symbolized two things: you and I are mortal, that is, subject to death; and you and I are sinners. As I mentioned in my homily that day, the remedy for both these realities, death and sin, is beyond our control. How so? As my spiritual director likes to put it regarding death, “None of us is going to get out of here alive!” And regarding sin, though our sinful action might have been under our control, being forgiven for our sin depends upon the one who has been offended choosing to be merciful to us and offering us pardon.

Turning to the events we celebrate during Holy Week and Easter, imagine for a moment what it would have been like for us if Jesus had not suffered and died. You see, His suffering and death made clear that Jesus was indeed truly human. Good Friday was not a case of play-acting. Jesus endured excruciating pain—physical, emotional, and spiritual. Physical pain in that the Romans had perfected crucifixion to be a truly horrific form of torture; emotional pain in terms of the shame of being bare and bloodied for all to see, insulted incessantly by the hostile crowd, abandoned by almost all of His disciples, and seeing the heart-wrenching pain on His own Mother’s face; spiritual pain to which Jesus gave voice from the Cross in the words, “My God, my God, why have You abandoned me?” Couldn’t Jesus have avoided this? Couldn’t He have accomplished the very thing about which He was taunted? Namely, to come down off that Cross. Certainly He could have, but He did not. Why? Because He wanted all of us to have not a shadow of a doubt but that He knows the pain and turmoil we human beings experience, that He has empathy and compassion on us in our travails. But, even more, Jesus knew that He was taking upon Himself the sins of us all and sacrificing His own life so that all of us could receive pardon for our sins—original and personal. As we sing at the Good Friday Liturgy, “Behold the wood of the Cross on which is hung our salvation.” Imagine if Jesus did not go through all that He did suffer on Good Friday, but instead at a given point He simply left this earth and returned to Heaven. Or imagine that He did suffer all that He did on Good Friday but never rose from the dead. In both hypothetical cases, we’d have received some great teachings of His, we might even have been impressed by some of the miracles He worked while on this earth, but after a while His teachings and the stories of His miracles would fade into the dustbin of history, and in all likelihood they might not have even come down to us in the 21st century.

But, thanks be to God, Jesus the Crucified has risen from the tomb! He has conquered death, has truly won forgiveness for our sins and the sins of all the world, and opened for us all the gates of Heavenly glory. And now, as we all deal with

the COVID-19 pandemic, we recognize how much we all need what Christ’s suffering, death, and glorious resurrection provide for us. Those suffering from this disease and their loved ones know that their Lord and Savior Jesus Christ empathizes with them in their pain, having His own firsthand experience of pain and agony, as does His Mother Mary, I might also add. Those healthcare personnel and other first responders are living, breathing images of Christ “the Physician” who healed people of their ailments and risked contagion Himself as He made contact with people with leprosy, for example. They also reflect the deep compassion and empathy of Christ in the selfless care they provide their patients.

At the same time we also appreciate perhaps more than any other Easter in recent memory that Christ’s victory over death in His rising from the dead is a victory He shares with all those who entrust themselves to Him. COVID-19 puts the reality of death squarely before us as we watch the news and read the statistics and the death toll from this disease every day. But death, my sisters and brothers, does not have the last word. Our risen Savior Jesus Christ has opened the pathway to Heaven for us all. St. Paul never tires of calling Jesus our risen Savior “the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep” in death. Christ’s resurrection was not merely for Himself alone. Christ is our trailblazer who endured all He suffered so that we might follow Him from death into eternal glory, joy, and peace.

I conclude my remarks with words from St. Augustine of Hippo in the 5th century that I hope will resonate with us all today, remarks I shared recently with the folks preparing to receive the Easter sacraments and enter our Church this year. The following comes from St. Augustine’s Sermon 256: “We are Easter people and ‘Alleluia’ is our song. Let us sing ‘Alleluia’ here and now in this life, even though we are oppressed by various worries, so that we may sing it one day in the world to come, when we are set free from all anxiety.”

A blessed Easter Day and Season to you and all your loved ones!

Read Reflect Respond

THEME: Jesus' resurrection—the heart of our faith, life, and journey.

As you hear this reading from the Gospel of John, what feeling does it arouse within you? What word or phrase catches your ear?

Gospel : John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb.

So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him."

So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first;

he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in.

When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place.

Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first,

and he saw and believed.

For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

Pastoral Ministry and Spiritual Care in the Midst of the COVID-19 Pandemic

Please know that our priests and pastoral staff are here for you during these difficult days. In the past, the priest would be able to go "in haste" to the bedside of the dying or administer the Sacrament of the Sick to those whose health or age warranted the Sacrament. During this pandemic the hospitals are very much setting the rules for visitations both of families and of Ministers.

Many hospitals and skilled care facilities are assisting the elderly to Skype/ Face Time/ or Zoom with family members as well as voice calls to pray with either the priest or another spiritual leader. If a family member has COVID-19, we can arrange a voice call with one of the priests and he will offer the prayers of the Church for comfort. In the event of an extreme emergency please call the Rectory.

If you or someone you know is concerned and would like to talk or pray, our Pastoral Associate will be pleased to pray with you via phone.

Our hearts are heavy that our direct Ministry of pastoral care and sacraments is so limited at this moment; however, it is truly for the safety of all that these directives have been enacted. Happy Easter! On this day we reflect in a special way on the presence of Jesus in our lives. One of them said that his image is a tandem bicycle. Jesus is in the front seat steering and we're in the back seat pedaling. This seemed to me to be a very apt description of where we are right now. All we need to do is have faith—and keep pedaling!

Rediscovering or Renewing our Spiritual Self During the Pandemic

These times are times of uncertainty, isolation, concern, suffering, heroism, and yes, hope. Celebrating the Resurrection in the midst of our isolation is the perfect reminder that we are an Easter people and our song is “Alleluia”.

God is always creative in his love! The Resurrection is a sure sign of his creative love. In the words of the *Exsultet* sung at the Easter Vigil, the Church calls forth all of creation to rejoice. “Sing, choirs of angels...rejoice, O earth!” The Resurrection is a cosmic event, which includes heaven and earth and links them together. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI wrote, “In the words of the *Exsultet* once again, **we can proclaim**: “Christ, who came back from the dead and shed his peaceful light on all mankind, your Son lives and reigns for ever and ever”. Amen!

The Church sings and praises the Creator because we celebrate:

- the definitive victory of the Creator and of his creation.
- this day of Resurrection as the origin and the goal of our existence.
- because now, thanks to the risen Lord, it is now definitively established that:
 - reason is stronger than unreason,
 - truth stronger than lies,
 - love stronger than death. (cf. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI)

The Resurrection reveals that the very last words of the Creation account has been definitively fulfilled: **“God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good”** (Gen 1:31). Amen.


God’s love is creative—the Resurrection reminds us that **“Love is stronger than death”** (Song 8:6). In these days of the pandemic, the mysteries of Easter cast a radiant and hopeful light on sickness and death, sadness and suffering, and isolation we are experiencing. **As an Easter people we remember our hope!** As an Easter people who, **this year singing our Alleluias from the isolation of our home, remember that we are not isolated**—we are the Body of Christ. As an Easter people we have hope that “this too shall pass” and a new moment will rise up!

This Easter we are reminded that the early Church celebrated “in the homes.” Now this is not to say that we do not return to our beautiful parish to worship and to live the sacramental life. No! **We need our Church which is both mother and pilgrim.** However, in this moment where the whole world is in stillness, let us set a designated place (altar) and a rhythm of life where we pray together as family. These days are days to create new or to re-instate a rhythm of prayer in our day and form new habits which include:

- brief morning prayer and evening prayer as family enfolding our day in God’s love;
- giving thanks by saying prayers over our food so not to take for granted the bountiful blessings we have;
- a basket of intentions that we offer—prayers remembering our needs, the needs of our neighbors, and most especially right now the needs of those suffering from the coronavirus and the caregivers.

This Easter reminds us the Resurrection is lived in our own lives. Alleluia! He has Risen! Alleluia! We too, my friends, will rise from this time—our God is with us and let us, with the rhythm of our new lives—say, we are with God! Alleluia!


Third grader Maddie enjoyed watching the First Friday School Mass last week.


