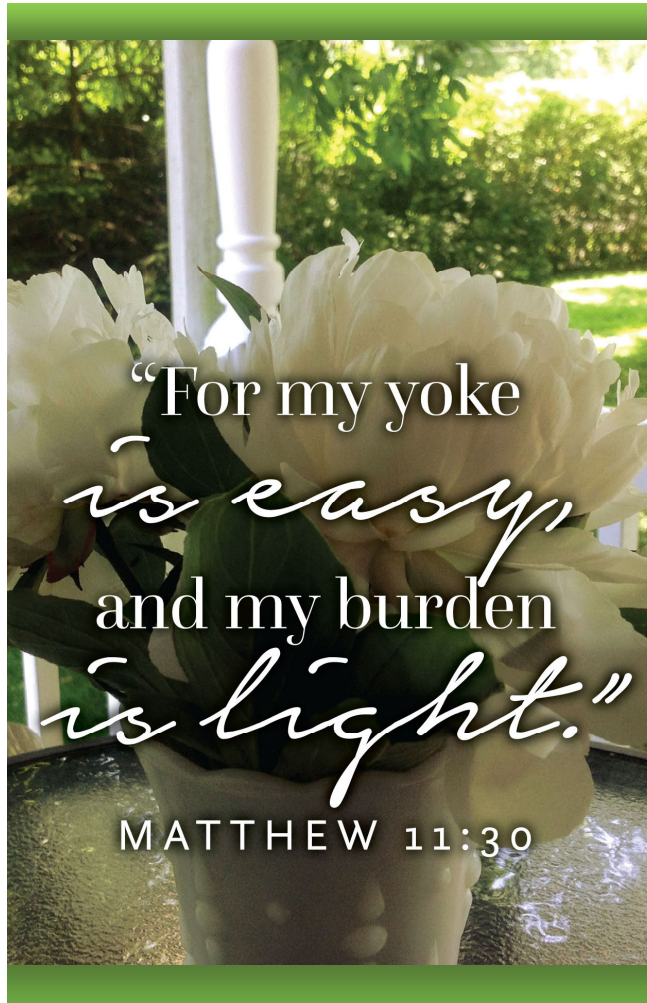

More than just colorful windows...

June 26, 2020

Like many churches around the world Saint Agatha is blessed with absolutely beautiful stained glass windows. Even though they are striking in color and beauty we can often look past them. One of the lessons, at least for me, during these difficult times is slowing down the pace of life. Have you ever walked into a church and NOT noticed these windows? I have! Even when we enter a sacred space with all its beauty the fast pace of life is with us.



Stained glass, like icons, are meant to be a window to the Divine. They move our thoughts from the fast pace of life to God. Stained glass windows within their beauty hold spiritual, artistic, and educational value. We use photographs to mark moments or events in our lives and share them with people through the years. They can activate all our senses and emotions just by looking at them. These sacred windows are meant to do the same for us. We connect with God and the life and works of Jesus. We look upon Saints and remember their lives and how they lived them. They take history and make it dynamic even now.

Sacred art is much more than just colors or depictions, they bring us closer to our Creator. Next time you walk into a church or are looking at Stained glass windows elsewhere think of them as a unique prayer card. Slow down and ponder what God has done for us. We ask anyone in attendance at Sunday Masses to fill out an online form so that we can have accurate contact information in case the need to contact attendees arises. You only need to fill out the form and leave your information one time.

If we were to discover that someone at any given Mass tests positive for COVID-19 in the following weeks, we want to be able to inform all of you so that, in consultation with your physician, you can take the appropriate steps. Please note that any notice will not include the name of the person who tested positive, which will be kept confidential, but only the Mass (date and time) which they attended and any other relevant non-personal information.

Even if you do not choose to leave your name and contact information, please know that we will make any announcement of a positive test on the parish website as well, so please check the website on a regular basis. At the public Masses, there will be 2 stations for Communion. Ambassadors will direct each section and row to come forward. Please wait until they direct your pew. Follow the arrows on the floor, maintaining Social Distancing, keeping your mask on as you approach the minister. You will receive the Body of Christ in your hand from the minister, then go directly to the "Communion Station" where you will lower your mask, consume the host, re-mask, then return to your pew. Everyone must return to the pews.

Gospel : Matthew:11: 25-30

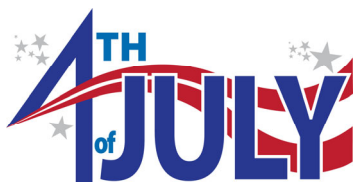
At that time Jesus exclaimed:

Many of you remember Msgr. Charles Anadore who lived in residence here at St. Agatha's for many years. Although he passed away in 2008 just short of his 95th birthday. Msgr. Anadore is still fondly remembered by many parishioners of all ages. He was famous for his "take-away thought" at the end of his homilies, and frequently this was one of his poems. Taking the First Step...

They say taking the first step is always the hardest and when it comes to recovery it's no different. Several years ago a friend invited me to join him on a vacation to Tanzania for a Safari. My initial reac-

tion was tepid out of fear for the unknown. He assured me that the trip would be safe and that he hired a guide for the entire trip. Without that guide we would have been lost and very likely would have put ourselves in dangerous situations. The same is true for living a life in recovery. The Steps are a guide for those seeking freedom from the traps of addiction.

Step One of *Alcoholics Anonymous*, “**We admitted we were powerless over alcohol—that our lives had become unmanageable.**”

The book, *Alcoholics Anonymous*, states that an alcoholic has an allergy. This is a fundamental principle of understanding for the alcoholic. When someone has a peanut allergy they don't say, “well I'll just have a little”. Even the smallest amount, if you have an allergy, can cause serious harm. So it is with alcohol and the alcoholic. Abstinence is the key to living a healthy whole life. If we understand this fundamental principle we can take that crucial First Step.

The first step tends to set the tone on any journey, this is also

true when we begin our journey in sobriety. The “Big Book”, or *Alcoholics Anonymous*, states that we must go through these Steps with “rigorous honesty”. If you're human then it's likely admitting you have a problem is not one of the most pleasurable activities. Some may say that the stronger and more powerful you are in society the more successful you are. Let the Sociologists debate that statement. If strength of will, character, or our bodies helped us to stop drinking, then we would not be looking to take Step One of AA. Fr. Martin, known well for his “Chalk Talks” (check them out on YouTube) says for the First Step we need, rigorous honesty, open mindedness, and a willingness.

Admitting we have a problem with alcohol is like a pre-step. Only when we believe we are **powerless**, that is to say, no strength of mine will help me stop, can we begin the recovery process. An absolute belief to the core, that I am unable to get myself out of this trouble that drinking causes.

Unmanageability is present in the Alcoholic even before that first drink. Many of us were not able to manage in our environment or respond to it in a healthy and positive way. So we take alcohol as a remedy to cope with life (environment, emotions, people, places and things). When we drink life becomes even more unmanageable! Lives are ruined.

Surrender to gain victory—The Great Paradox of Recovery

The Steps help guide us to a healthier lifestyle and tools to respond to life in a positive way.

Although I have written about alcohol in this post it applies for ANYTHING that we have an addiction to.

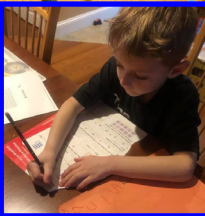

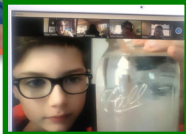
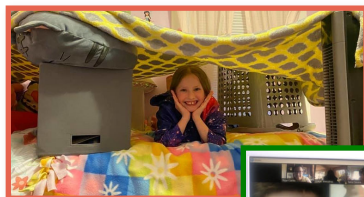
First Day of School, Halloween parade, Christmas concert, Social Studies Fair, and a Spelling Bee...



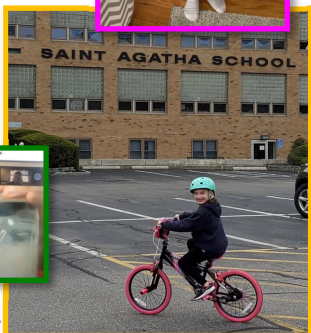
The 2019-2020 school year started out as any other. Then in mid-March a global pandemic threw everyone a curve and school went remote for safety.

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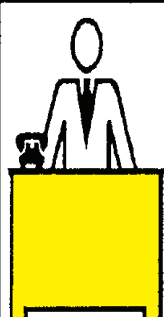
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
