A Note from Our Pastor,

On the cover of our parish bulletin you'll note that we have three deacons listed. Deacon Dan Sullivan is known and beloved by all of us, especially most recently as he together with Noel Schaub has been so dedicated to being at the controls to livestream our daily Masses and two of our weekend Masses each week. Deacon Kevin Martin is another permanent deacon who has recently joined our parish and has served as deacon at weekend Masses and celebrated the Sacrament of Baptism here as well. Later this month Deacon Kevin will be preaching at a couple of our weekend Masses. The third deacon listed is Deacon Stephen Ondrey who is a transitional deacon, meaning that he is in his final year of preparation for the ordained priesthood at Pope St. John XXIII National Seminary in Weston. His recent predecessors here were (now) Fr. Shawn Simchock of Scranton, PA, Fr. Seraphim Wirth, fbp, of the Franciscan Brothers of Peace in Minneapolis-St. Paul, MN, and Fr. Baldemar Garza now at Holy Name Parish in West Roxbury. Our new Deacon Stephen hails from the Diocese of Columbus, Ohio, and was a dentist prior to his entering Pope St. John Seminary. We're looking forward to having him "dig his teeth" into parish ministry here at St. Agatha's! Deacon Ondrey has just begun his final year at the seminary and will be joining us on weekends beginning either this weekend or next. Our parish has certainly been blessed by the dedicated and faithful ministry of deacons, both permanent and transitional! Please note in upcoming bulletins information about the Permanent Diaconate program here in the Archdiocese of Boston and the application process.

As I am writing this column on Tuesday September 8th, I had a very enjoyable time joining with our St. Agatha School Principal Mrs. Nancy Carr and the teachers in welcoming students from Kindergarten to Grade 4 to St. Agatha School for the beginning of another academic

year. As you might imagine, there have been extraordinary preparations throughout the summer getting the school building ready to welcome and welcome back our students. With our School's enrollment having increased by almost 100 students from last year, there will be a lot of energy and excitement in store for our school community.

For all grades (First through Tenth grade) in our Faith Formation program, registration is now open on the St. Agatha Parish website. For grades 1 through 8, registration will close at midnight this coming Monday the 14th.

In our Church Calendar, Monday we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, so that we might ponder once again the amazing faithfulness and love of Christ for each one of us in laying down His life in order for the likes of you and me to enjoy the fullness of life, here by grace, and hereafter in glory. The next day, Tuesday, we honor Mary our Blessed Mother under the title of Our Lady of Sorrows, as she knows personally the pain we experience, especially as she had her heart pierced by the suffering and death of her dearly beloved Son. On Wednesday we celebrate the memorial of two contemporaries of our own patroness St. Agatha, who, like her, were put to death for their faith in Christ and also because of their role in leading the Church in the middle of the third century: Pope St. Cornelius in Rome and St. Cyprian the bishop of Carthage in North Africa. Thursday we remember and honor the 17th-century Jesuit theologian, teacher, and Cardinal, Saint Robert Bellarmine who is the patron saint of Canon lawyers and catechists—very appropriate as we begin a new school year and a new year of Faith Formation!

When you hear the Gospel proclaimed today, what words or phrases really strike you? What lingers in your memory from this reading?

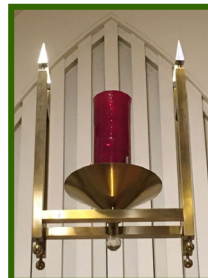
Gospel : Matthew 18: 21-35

Peter approached Jesus and asked him,
 "Lord, if my brother sins against me,
 how often must I forgive?"
 As many as seven times?"
 Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times
 but seventy-seven times.
 That is why the kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king
 who decided to settle accounts with his servants.
 When he began the accounting,
 a debtor was brought before him
 who owed him a huge amount.
 Since he had no way of paying it back,
 his master ordered him to be sold,
 along with his wife, his children, and all his property,
 in payment of the debt.
 At that, the servant fell down, did him homage, and said,
 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back in full.'
 Moved with compassion the master of that servant
 let him go and forgave him the loan.
 When that servant had left, he found one of his fellow servants
 who owed him a much smaller amount.
 He seized him and started to choke him, demanding,
 'Pay back what you owe.'
 Falling to his knees, his fellow servant begged him,
 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.'
 But he refused.
 Instead, he had the fellow servant put in prison
 until he paid back the debt.
 Now when his fellow servants saw what had happened,
 they were deeply disturbed, and went to their master
 and reported the whole affair.
 His master summoned him and said to him,
 'You wicked servant!
 I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to.
 Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant,
 as I had pity on you?'
 Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers
 until he should pay back the whole debt.
 So will my heavenly Father do to you,
 unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart."

THE WEEKLY UPDATE

This past week you may have noticed that the bells in the tower are playing again! We were able to finally get someone out to repair the system. As a reminder, here is how our bells work. There are two components, both of which are controlled remotely by a console called the "Swinging Tower". The first is comprised of the 13 real bells that were installed back in the 1960's these are very impressive and hang in the tower facing Adams St. The largest bell weighs well over 1,000 pounds, and the smallest weighs around 35 pounds. The bells had been out of use for a number of years and restoring all of them to working order was prohibitively expensive. But we did have the three largest restored about 15 years ago. These are the bells you hear on the hour, as a funeral toll, a wedding peal and for the Angelus and they are controlled by the console located behind the organ in the Upper Church. The second component of the system is a carillon program which plays songs using sounds manufactured to sound just like our real bells. These can be heard playing songs 10-15 minutes before the weekend Masses, after Masses, on some Holidays (e.g. July 4th) and special Holy Days, most notably Christmas and Easter. Like the real bells, these are programmed and controlled by the console in the room behind the organ in the Upper Church. The system has become a little outdated and will need some upgrading, but for the time being they're sounding great and hopefully those sounds will help to lift spirits!

SACRAMENTAL CELEBRATIONS

Baptism: 2:00pm on the 2nd/ 4th Sundays of each month. If you have already scheduled your child's Baptism and need to reschedule (or to ask any other questions), please call or email the Rectory.

Reconciliation: Wednesday evenings from 6:30-8:00pm in the Meeting Room adjacent to the Gathering Space in the lower church. **Masks required.** Also available by appointment with one of our priests.

Marriage: Call one of the parish priests or deacon. Arrangements are ordinarily to be made at least 6 months before the proposed marriage.

We ask anyone in attendance at Sunday Masses to fill out an online form so that we can have accurate contact information in case the need to contact attendees arises. You only need to fill out the form and leave your information one time.

If we were to discover that someone at any given Mass tests positive for COVID-19 in the following weeks, we want to be able to inform all of you so that, in consultation with your physician, you can take the appropriate steps. Please note that any notice will not include the name of the person who tested positive, which will be kept confidential, but only the Mass (date and time) which they attended and any other relevant non-personal information.

Even if you do not choose to leave your name and contact information, please know that we will make any announcement of a positive test on the parish website as well, so please check the website on a regular basis. CRS in Lebanon: Special Request for Support

On August 4 a devastating chemical explosion in Beirut, Lebanon killed at least 170 people, wounded 6,000, and displaced hundreds of thousands, with families continuing to live in damaged homes, without doors and windows, or reliable electricity, and many are going hungry. Major hospitals are damaged or overwhelmed with COVID-19, leaving injured and sick patients to rely on mobile clinics. Meanwhile, the risk of community spread of COVID-19 continues to increase. Additionally, the initial shock of the blast together with uncertainty about the future are causing high levels of stress and anxiety. The affected individuals and families need immediate support to clean and repair their homes, to provide for food and other basic needs, to access urgent medical care and psychological support. Catholic Relief Services is working closely with Caritas Lebanon, other Caritas agencies in Beirut, and other faith-based partners and in coordinating desperately needed relief efforts. 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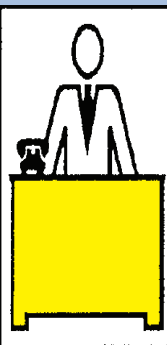
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
