A Note from Our Pastor,

This first weekend in the month of October, we recall that October is a month especially dedicated both to Respect Life and to Mary our Blessed Mother. Thank you to all who witness to the dignity of human life in all its marvelous stages from conception until natural death: assisting those dealing with challenging pregnancies to choose life for their babies; contacting our political representatives on the local, state, and national levels to oppose legislation such as the Roe Act and to encourage support of pro-life legislation or pro-life nominees to the various courts; being involved with Special Olympics or the Knights of Columbus Tootsie Roll Drive; volunteering at homeless shelters and food pantries; reaching out to shut-ins in their own homes or nursing facilities; visiting the imprisoned; providing palliative care and comfort to those nearing the end of their earthly lives. May all of us make a point during this month, through our prayers and through our loving service of someone we know who is in need, to show that we have a deep respect and reverence for the great gift that is human life.

Please note below in the bulletin information about the Public Square Rosary Crusade in Quincy this year sponsored by America Needs Fatima. The Rosary will be prayed this coming Saturday the 10th from Noon until 1pm at the corner of Hancock St. and Walter J. Hannon Parkway. Parking is available at St. John's Church at 44 School St.

It's been a joy for Fr. Makos and me to be able to celebrate a total of 4 Opening Masses for the St. Agatha School community. The reason for four Masses is that our school enrollment has increased by 100 students, and the social distancing in our Church allows for no more than two grades at a time to be present for Mass. Thanks to Deacon Dan Sullivan these Masses are livestreamed so that parents and other family members can participate from home.

To mark two important Memorials in early October, namely the Memorial of St. Francis of Assisi and the Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary, our Faith Formation students from grades 1 through 6 and other animal lovers are invited to bring their **friendly** pets for a blessing to commemorate St. Francis (whose feast day on Oct. 4 gets bumped this year because it falls on this Sunday) and to pray a decade of the Rosary in honor of the Blessed Mother under the title of Our Lady of the Rosary (Oct. 7). Both the pets' blessing and the praying of a decade of the Rosary will occur on Wednesday, October 7 at 4pm, and Thursday, October 8 at 6pm, in the front park-

ing lot. The registration form can be found on our parish website under Faith Formation Grades 1-6.

Just a reminder about some recurring events. The Rosary is recited right before the 9am Mass Monday through Saturday. There is Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament every Friday after the 9am Mass. If there is a funeral that day, Adoration will conclude at 10:30 and the Funeral will begin at 11am that day. If there is no funeral Adoration will continue until Noon. The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is available every Wednesday evening from 6:30 until 8pm in the Library/Meeting Room in the back of the Gathering Space.

I was very happy to participate in Holy Smokes last Monday evening with some of our teens. At least 30 teens were present for games, conversation, and prayer all around a vibrant bonfire. Our Youth Minister Helen Waring and Gabrielle Hunt oversaw this enjoyable and prayerful evening. Helen and Gabrielle will continue to hold Holy Smokes on Monday evenings from 7 to 8pm on the patio behind the chapel.

Brothers and sisters:

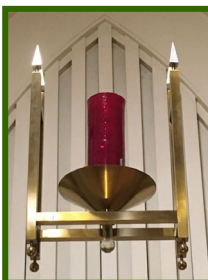
Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God.

THE WEEKLY UPDATE

Suffice it to say, 2020 has been a year when nothing seems to have gone as planned. So it probably won't come as a surprise to anyone that our Grand Annual sequence will be a little different than it has in the past. As you may recall, in previous years we have published the full Annual report towards the end of October and conducted the Grand Annual after that. However, this year, because of the widening of our Offertory gap between actual and budgeted (see the Weekly Offertory Report) the deficit that we had projected at the beginning of the year is increasing and requires immediate intervention. The following chart illustrates the significance of the problem:

What this chart captures is the fact that in FY 20 although our actual expenses were \$21,570 less than budgeted, we ended up with a deficit of \$19,339 because of an income shortfall of \$40,909, driven by the onset of the COVID-19 crisis during the last quarter of the fiscal year. The shortfall is exacerbated in FY 21 because of a drastic reduction in our Offertory collection. Anticipating a drop-off in Offertory contributions we lowered the budgeted target from \$650,000 in FY 20 to \$561,000 in FY 21, but as you can see we are running almost \$8,000 below that reduced number. So even though we reduced our budgeted expenses by nearly \$157,000, we are projecting a deficit this year of \$102,540.

All of this information heightens the critical importance of this year's Grand Annual Appeal. Last year's Appeal was the most successful in many years, and had it not been so successful last year's deficit would have more than doubled. So the hope is that this year's Grand Annual will help to reduce if not eliminate the potential deficit we face. You will be receiving a letter and pledge/payment card from Fr. Palardy within the next 10 days. In this year like none other, we ask that you be as prayerfully generous as your means allow. Thanks so much for your ongoing support of the parish.

In addition to the Weekly Offertory total, an additional \$900 was contributed to the special collection for the Clergy Health & Retirement Fund bringing the final total to \$5,136. Thank you.

Permanent Diaconate Inquirers Program: Is Christ Calling You?

God is calling each of us to serve one another in charity and love and Pope Francis speaks to this call constantly. The Permanent Diaconate, restored at Vatican II, is a ministry of service that is open to married and single men. The deacon's ministry, in the words of Blessed Pope John Paul II, "is the Church's service sacramentalized."

If you are discerning God's possible call to serve the Church as a minister of Charity, Word, and Sacrament as an ordained deacon in the Archdiocese of Boston, you and your wife are invited to take part in the upcoming **Online Inquirer Webinar Program**. The second option for the first session begins on October 6.

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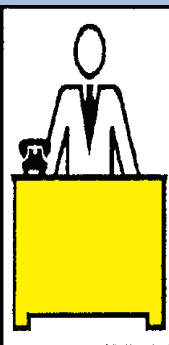
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
