A Note from Our Pastor,

I call your attention to several items below in this week's bulletin.

Families with children in our Faith Formation program are invited to come to the white garages behind the rectory this Wednesday February 10th from 11:30am to 1pm or from 3:30 to 5:30pm in order to pick up Lenten Craft Materials including a Family Kit of Ashes for the family to use on Ash Wednesday the following week.

The Winter Coat Drive will continue until February 20th. Please drop your gently used coats after weekend Masses into one of the bins outside the garages behind the rectory.

Ash Wednesday is February 17th, a week from this coming Wednesday. We'll have Masses at 9am and 7pm with the distribution of ashes via Q-tips. There will also be a Service with the Liturgy of the Word and distribution of ashes at 1pm. Following that Service, we'll also be available to distribute ashes in the parking lot.

Please also note that there will be an online Lenten Retreat on Wednesday February 24th at 7pm. The topic will be "Journey with St. Joseph" and sponsored by St. John's Seminary. The presenter will be Father Donald Calloway, MIC, who authored Consecration to St. Joseph.

The final item I want to mention at this time is that our Parish's Baby Shower to assist new mothers in need through Friends of the Unborn will take place a little later than usual this year—the weekend of March 20-21. With the troubling initiatives in this area coming out of Washington and our own State House these days, this Baby Shower is a wonderful opportunity to show that we Catholics are pro-life and do indeed "put our money where our mouth is," so to speak!

In our Church Calendar this week we celebrate on Monday the memorial of two saints. St. Jerome Emiliani was a priest and former soldier from 16th-century Venice, who founded a religious community which served the poor and educated the young. He is patron saint of orphans and abandoned children. We also honor on Wednesday St. Josephine Bakhita who lived in the late 19th and well into the 20th century. She was from Sudan, raised as a Muslim, kidnapped, sold as a slave, and eventually landed in Italy. She became a Catholic Christian there, was granted her freedom, became a sister in the Canossian Daughters of Charity and was beloved as a teacher on account of her very kindly nature and her wonderful singing voice. St. Josephine is the first Sudanese person canonized a saint. On Wednesday we observe the memorial of another wonderful woman: Saint Scholastica. She lived in Italy in the 6th century and was the sister of St. Benedict the founder

of western monasticism. St. Scholastica was the head of a convent of sisters and on at least one occasion through her fervent prayer got the upper hand over her saintly brother!

On Thursday February 11th we commemorate the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes when our Blessed Mother appeared to St. Bernadette in 1858 in France. On this day we observe the World Day of the Sick. I shall close my column this week with some remarks made a few years ago by our Holy Father Pope Francis for the World Day of the Sick:

Like Saint Bernadette, we stand beneath the watchful gaze of Mary. The humble maiden of Lourdes tells us that the Virgin, whom she called "the Lovely Lady", looked at her as one person looks at another. Those simple words describe the fullness of a relationship. Bernadette, poor, illiterate, and ill, felt that Mary was looking at her as a person. The Lovely Lady spoke to her with great respect and without condescension. This reminds us that every person is, and always remains, a human being, and is to be treated as such. The sick and those who are disabled, even severely, have their own inalienable dignity and mission in life. They never become simply objects. If at times they appear merely passive, in reality that is never the case. ...Let us ask Mary Immaculate for the grace always to relate to the sick as persons who certainly need assistance, at times even for the simplest of things, but who have a gift of their own to share with others.

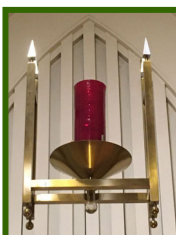
As you listen to the stories of Jesus healing the people, what strikes you about it? What do you detect in Jesus that strengthens his ministry??

THE WEEKLY UPDATE

Last week we began the repair and painting of walls and ceilings in the Church which had experienced water infiltration due to exterior masonry defects which were corrected during the large capital repair project. These areas are primarily in the entrance and foyer areas where the masonry problems were compounded by flat roofs which are notorious for membrane leaks. Because of the height of some of the ceilings the project will take a couple of weeks to complete. At the same time we will be repairing the inside of the walls behind the organ where the pipes have been removed for restoration. These walls were also damaged by water leaks, and the plaster and dust was one of the problems that affected the pipes. If you would like to learn more about the organ pipe restoration please refer to Julie Fay's excellent chronology which has been running each week in the Bulletin. As promised, over the next couple of weeks we will be inserting Semi-annual Financial Reports for both the Parish and School in the Weekly Bulletin. ASH WEDNESDAY ~ February 17

We will be celebrating **Mass on Ash Wednesday** at **9am** and **7pm** and distributing ashes (using Q-tips) at the conclusion of Mass.

We will also have the **Liturgy of the Word** at **1pm** with distribution of ashes. For those not comfortable with attending inside, we will be distributing ashes in the parking lot immediately following the 1pm Service.



Each year St. Agatha Parish shows its support for the unborn by conducting a “**Baby Shower**” after all of the Masses on a given weekend with donations of baby items and cash gratefully accepted. This year, when the lives of our unborn brothers and sisters are facing new and dangerous threats, our support is more important than ever. We need to speak loudly by our actions and show that we truly are God’s hands on Earth. Unfortunately the pandemic has changed the way many things are done out of an abundance of caution for everyone’s health and safety. So this year’s Baby Shower will be a bit different. Normally the shower would be in February and would include a celebration with refreshments in the Gathering Space and a wide variety of items would be accepted. This year the shower has been moved to the weekend of the first day of Spring which is **March 20-21**. This seemed fitting since we are celebrating the importance of each new life created by God. We will be accepting new baby clothing that can be dropped off at a table staffed by volunteers, and we will be adding a special second collection at all of the Masses called “Collection for Life” that weekend that will go strictly to supporting the lives of unborn children and their mothers. Organ Restoration Update

Last week, we learned about the restoration of the pipes of the Great organ. When the Great pipes were removed and transported last month,

the Antiphonal division went with them.

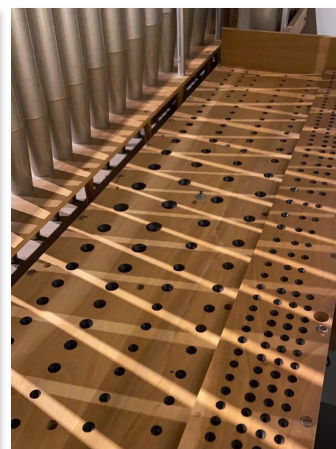
The Antiphonal pipes are housed in the loft at the back of the church. With only five ranks, the Antiphonal division is the smallest of the four divisions of the organ. Used on its own, it adds interest and direction, but when used with the other divisions, it contributes to the “surround sound” effect of the organ. The Antiphonal pipes can add a particularly festive and celebratory touch with the brighter tones, or contribute to a more contemplative mood with the mel-lower ones.

The approximately 300 pipes will be cleaned, tested, repaired and re-packed for transport back to their home in the loft over the next few weeks.

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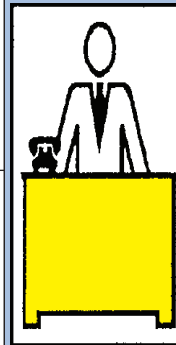
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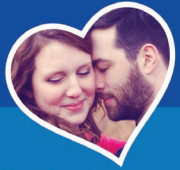
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
