

### *A Note from Our Pastor,*

Sisters and brothers, I hope your Lent is off to a good start. Because of COVID-19 it can seem as though we have been living Lent for about a year now! But there is another way to look at this Lenten Season. Just as our cars require a tune-up every year or so, Lent is a time for us to have a spiritual tune-up, so to speak: to grow in our love for the Lord, and a more heartfelt commitment to Him, and to conduct ourselves more wholeheartedly as His faithful disciples.

Fasting, prayer, and almsgiving are the time-tested practices that we embrace during Lent, out of love for Christ and for the benefit of others. Fasting has among its goals to make us less selfish and self-centered. So, consider one specific thing or activity that you'll do without this Lent in order to be a little more unselfish. Prayer has among its goals to make us more aware of, attuned to, and responsive to God's presence, God's action, God's love in our lives. Think of engaging in one spiritual practice—a prayer like the Rosary, a devotion like the Stations of the Cross, a half hour before the Blessed Sacrament, daily Mass, for example, to provide God a greater place in your life and your heart. Almsgiving has among its goals to make us more aware of, attuned to, and responsive to others, and particularly to others in need—materially, emotionally, spiritually. Notice others in their need and respond—by making a financial contribution to an organization that cares for the poor; by calling or visiting with someone you know who is lonely, or feels isolated or neglected; by praying with or for someone you know who is grieving the death of a loved one, or is struggling with a chronic illness, or wonders if God has abandoned him or her.

On Wednesdays during Lent from 6:30 until 8pm Confessions will be heard in the Library/Meeting Room in the rear of the Gathering Space. In addition, at the same time there will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the Chapel off of the Gathering Space. The Holy Eucharist will be exposed on the Altar in the Monstrance at 6:30 with the opportunity for prayer in silence until just before 8pm when the time of Adoration will conclude with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, the recitation of the Divine Praises, and the concluding hymn “Holy God We Praise Thy Name”.

Another wonderful opportunity is the Lenten Retreat offered online by St. John Seminary in Brighton. There will be 4 priest-presenters for this retreat focused on St. Joseph. It will take place this Wednesday the 24<sup>th</sup> at 7pm. A registration link can be found in this bulletin.

This weekend there is a bottle and can drive to support our Youth Ministry Program. In addition this is the final weekend to drop off your gently used coats to help the needy.

Both the bottle and can drive and the coat drive will be conducted at the garages behind the rectory.

Monday at 7pm there is Bonfire and Prayer for high school students.

Thursday at 7pm there will be a virtual trivia night with Cubey Entertainment sponsored by St. Agatha School. Registration information can be found on the final page of this bulletin.

This week's second collection supports Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Boston. Next week also there will be a special collection supporting Catholic Relief Services, the Church in Africa and in Central and Eastern Europe, and the Military Archdiocese, Home Missions, and the Black and Indian Missions here in the United States.

As you begin your Lenten journey this year, may you and all your loved ones be blessed by the Lord, as we all strive with His grace to follow Him ever more closely.


**February 21 ~ First Sunday of Lent**


### Book Series via ZOOM!

## Operations Note—FY 2021 School Semi-Annual Financial Report

Last week we presented the semi-annual financial report for the Parish for the first half of Fiscal Year 2021. This week we will review the School financial performance for that same period.

It's hard to imagine that nearly one year ago—March 13, 2020 to be exact—St. Agatha School students had their last day of in-person learning for the 2019-20 academic year. From that point forward all educational activities were done remotely thanks to the tremendous dedication and versatility of school staff under the leadership of Mrs. Nancy Carr. Although certainly not ideal, the students received a quality and rigorous education for the remainder of the school year with the hope and expectation that the new school year would bring a return to in-person learning.

As with the Parish, the School began this Fiscal Year 2021 in July in a somewhat precarious financial position since the key metric—the number of students who would be attending—was very uncertain. Late in Fiscal Year 2020 we had applied for and received a loan from the Small Business Administration under the Payroll Protection Program (PPP) for \$329,100 which enabled us to stabilize our finances since we had lost major sources of income including the suspension of the weekly Bingo game. This loan quite simply made it possible the School to meet all of its financial obligations, the most important of which was paying the teachers for the remainder of the school year. In all likelihood the full amount of the loan will be forgiven under the terms of the PPP, so we are grateful to the Federal government for their assistance. Early in the Summer, for a variety of reasons and with thorough consideration of the extensive planning and rigorous implementation that would be required, the decision was made to re-open the school in September with full in-person learning. The response of families was almost instantaneously positive and the school's enrollment by summer's end had jumped by nearly 100 students. The gratitude and enthusiasm of both parents and students was palpable.

On July 1, 2020 the budget that was approved by the Parish Finance Council reflected an enrollment of 245 students. It also reflected the total loss of Bingo income (approximately \$170,000) and a major reduction in other fundraising income. However, in September it was clear that a major revision—a positive one—would need to be made to reflect the dramatic increase in students as well as the increased expenses that were necessary to hire additional faculty, to purchase additional supplies and equipment to insure everyone's health and safety and to provide access to the technology necessary to provide a quality educational experience. The major adjustment on the income side was the sharp increase in tuition revenue of just over \$600,000 as a result of the increase in students. We were also very fortunate to receive a grant of \$100,000 which helped offset the loss of Bingo income. On the other hand, income from the Extended Day Program and fundraising activities were sharply down. Expenses have understandably shown an increase as well. \$2,200 per month was added to the cleaning company's contract to sanitize the school each day. Additional funding was necessary for the purchase of special disinfectant which was the best on the market for combatting the coronavirus, but also the most expensive, and the purchase of an electrostatic sprayer which enhances its effectiveness even further. The school also purchased 90 chrome books to supplement equipment bought in the last fiscal year.

The income statement above is a snapshot of where things stood on December 31, 2020. By way of a caveat, there is a critical point to keep in mind. If one looks solely at the bottom line under the actual spending and expenses through December 31, it would appear to show a surplus of \$366,458. However, it is important to recognize that this is a snapshot based on actual spending and income at that point and not indicative of where we will be at the end of the fiscal year. For instance, although our spending continues through June 30<sup>th</sup>, our available cash diminishes progressively throughout the last quarter of the fiscal year, since tuition revenue is collected over the ten months ending in April and our other sources of income such as fundraising are not expected to reach budgeted targets. The Extended Day Program has been forced to operate at a reduced capacity and for shorter hours due to the pandemic, and one of the major fundraisers (Hot Lunch Program) has not been operating at all, again due to the pandemic.

Overall the financial news for the School is positive and bodes well for a healthy fiscal end to 2021 and a continued and vigorous upswing for the 2021-22 school year. Re-enrollment has been strong already and new applications are pouring in. Any report—financial or otherwise—on the school would be incomplete with a word of praise and gratitude for the staff in the school. Under very trying and unprecedented times, Mrs. Carr and her staff have displayed their dedication to the mission of the school and their devotion to the children and their families by creating a safe and supportive in-person Catholic learning experience. We are blessed by their presence.

At the end of March there will be an update on this report and that of the Parish, including the status of the operating bank accounts and the reserve accounts. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to give me a call or send me an email.


