

A Note from Our Pastor,

Because our bulletin has to go to press earlier than usual this week, in order for us to receive them back in time to place Catholic Appeal envelopes in them, my column will

be a bit briefer than usual. First, I am very grateful to Mr. Stephen Wessling for once again this year being our parish's Catholic Appeal Coordinator and for speaking at all our Masses last weekend. I want to reiterate what I said following Steve's remarks at the two Masses I celebrated last Sunday. The Archdiocese has been very helpful to us during this pandemic. I'll mention three examples: first, the Archdiocese tipped us off as to an excellent sanitizing product that we have been using throughout the pandemic to cleanse the church building; second, when we had one incident a number of months ago of a churchgoer informing us that he tested positive for COVID, we received excellent instructions about how to proceed so as to help ensure everyone's continued good health and safety; and, third, we were greatly helped by the Archdiocese in order for us to make our payroll both for the parish and the school in the early months of the pandemic last year. I intend to contribute to the Appeal myself again this year; I thank the sizable number of parishioners who have already contributed to this year's Appeal; and I urge those of you who have the financial means available to you to make your contribution as well. The Appeal funds the central ministries of our Archdiocese, and these central ministries have been exceedingly helpful to us through the years, and especially during this period of COVID-19. Pastoral Planning

March 7 ~ Third Sunday of Lent

In today's Gospel, we have a scene that may make us uncomfortable. Jesus knew that some of the temple practices were rife with social injustices. What made matters worse were that it was done in the name of religion. Jesus' heart ached to think that any Gentile seeking the presence of God would feel unwelcome in the house of God. If Jesus were to enter this church/parish, would he find an exclusiveness, a coldness, or a place where the "seeking" stranger finds welcome, solace and peace? Lent gives us the opportunity to examine our attitudes and make the necessary change so that every person feels welcome in this house of God. The pandemic restrictions need not hinder becoming a strong evangelizing parish.

THE WEEKLY UPDATE

As we enter the final fiscal quarter of FY 2021 it is time to look towards FY 2022 and plan the budgets for both the Parish and School. We are all hopeful that things will begin to return to some sense of normality by the time the new fiscal year starts in July, but there are certainly no guarantees. This makes the budgeting process a bit tenuous and clearly the budgets will both be the best projections possible given what we know, but also may need to be revised if circumstances do not improve. As one would expect, the School budget is very much driven by the enrollment. At this time the numbers appear to be strong for next year, and we are anticipating at least as many students next year as we have this year. In fact, we have already received over 100 new applications. The School began accepting new students last week, so we should have a fairly reliable enrollment number by the end of this month. The Parish is much different in that it is much more difficult to forecast revenue. We have held our own this year with the help of the Payroll Protection Program, but FY 2022 will be a much different year. The Finance Council met last week, so more on this in future Operations Notes.

This column usually focuses on dollars and cents and bricks and mortar. But those things are only important in that they enable us to fulfill our Mission as a Catholic Christian community. On the weekend of March 20-21 we have the opportunity to make a strong statement of affirmation of our commitment to help our most vulnerable brothers and sisters: pre-born children. Their right to life has been under increasing assault both nationally and within our own state, so our support is more important than ever. On that weekend we will have our annual Pro-Life Baby Shower. Volunteers will be in the Gathering Space to accept gifts of new baby clothes, and we will be having a second collection that weekend for agencies that provide critical support to pre-born children and their mothers. Please do whatever you can to send a message that life—all life—is a precious gift from God.

In addition to the Weekly Offertory reported below, \$1,480 was contributed to the Special Collection for The Church around the World. Thank you for your support.



Organ Restoration Update

Restoring the pipes of our pipe organ has been a major focus of the organ work done thus far. There was also an upgrade to the

main power supply, about which I wrote in January. Additional electrical work was completed in February to increase reliability and improve the communication between the console and the pipes.

As Timothy Smith wrote in his proposal to restore the organ, "The console is the organist's only hope of turning this machinery into music, so the console has to be made reliable." Smith was referring to the tendency of the console to behave in surprising ways at times—meaning that sometimes when a combination setting was created or used, the electronic memory did not always retain or act on that setting. This meant that sometimes when I was expecting one sound out of the organ, I got quite another, or nothing at all! Obviously, this was not ideal, especially during a liturgy. So, on February 19, the internal components of the organ console underwent enhanced maintenance, to restore functionality and consistency.

relay was installed in the Great chamber. This circuit board receives electrical signals from the console and amplifies them. The boosted electrical signal is relaved to the motors that control the moving parts that in turn control wind to the pipes. With this improvement, we now have increased reliability that the wind will get to the organ ranks controlled by individual drawknobs on the console.

The combined console electri-

cal work and new stop-action relay provide improved electronic reliability for the organ. This means that the sound we expect is the sound we will hear from the organ—a great and happy improvement.


