A Note from Our Pastor,

Beginning today we celebrate the most sacred week of the whole Christian year, with Palm/Passion Sunday this weekend. We recall the triumphant entry into Jerusalem of our Lord, as well as the turn of events that brought Him to the Cross just a few days later. A fine way to symbolize this is to turn the palm branch we receive this weekend into a cross, making it a visible reminder of how the praise and adulation that Jesus received soon changed into hostility that led to His death. One lesson for us all is that we should not be caught up in garnering praise from others, but, as St. Paul put it, to find our glory only in the Cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

On Wednesday from 6:00 until 8:00pm Confessions will be heard in the Library/Meeting Room in the rear of the Gathering Space. If there is need for a second priest for Confessions, the sacristy in the Upper Church will be used as well. Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place in the Chapel at the same time.

Recognizing the awesome love that Jesus has for each one of us, as He submitted Himself to excruciating pain and shame, so that He might draw each one of us to Himself and to share in the eternal glory of His resurrection from the dead, let us try to be present at the blessed events that we commemorate in the Sacred Triduum. All our Holy Week liturgies will be livestreamed as well. Our Art and Environment ministers, our organist, other instrumentalists, cantors, and choir, our other lay ministers, deacons, and priests offer you our best efforts so that the Lord may touch your hearts and lives very deeply at the Mass of the Lord’s Supper on Holy Thursday Evening, at the Liturgy of the Passion on Good Friday, at the Easter Vigil Saturday night, and all the Easter Masses on Sunday. Please try to make the time in your schedules to renew your own faith in and love for the Lord by praying with and for your sisters and brothers in Christ who form the St. Agatha Parish family, during these beautiful, poignant, and sacred liturgies Thursday through Sunday.

The liturgical schedule for Holy Week here at St. Agatha’s can be found on the cover of this bulletin. I point out several items. On Thursday, Friday, and Saturday there are no morning Masses, but Morning Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours will be prayed at 9am all 3 days in the Upper Church. On Thursday after the Mass of the Lord’s Supper concludes, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will continue until 10pm in the Upper Church this year, for social-distancing reasons. On

Good Friday, in addition to Morning Prayer, there will be two Liturgies of the Lord’s Passion with Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion at 3 and 7:30pm. On Holy Saturday the Easter Vigil will begin at 7:30pm. Finally, on Easter Sunday, Masses will be at 7:30, 9:30, and 11:30am in the Church, and at 9:30 and 11:30am on the patio and grass behind the Chapel. Participation at these Easter Sunday Masses requires prior registration. For those who will be participating in Easter Masses via livestream, at 1pm Easter Sunday Holy Communion will be made available in the front parking lot. (The one and only collection at the Easter Masses supports the health care and retirement needs of the priests of our Archdiocese. Thank you in advance for your generosity).

THE WEEKLY UPDATE

We’re back into one of those cycles when the Bulletin needs to be submitted far in advance of the weekend it will be read. So even though you may be seeing this on Palm Sunday weekend, it was actually written around St. Patrick’s Day! That explains why the Offertory totals and the total for the Collection for Life which happened last weekend are not in this week’s Note. They will be included in the note for Easter Sunday. Under the category of “Good News” I am happy to report that we have finally restored our American flag! As you may recall, just about a year ago the flag was completely destroyed by a violent snowstorm with accompanying winds of near hurricane force. Not only was the flag destroyed, but it became embedded in the rope to which it was attached and the rope and pulleys were also damaged. We were able to get the flag, rope and pulley down, but getting someone during the pandemic to come up with a bucket truck with enough extension to reach the top of the flag pole turned out to be a real challenge. I repeatedly asked Fr. Palardy if he would climb the pole to do the repair work, but he declined citing some sort of law of gravity that convinced him that such a venture would not end well! This past week Hunt Landscaping and Tree Service graciously donated their services to do the repair and so Old Glory has returned to its perch. I, along with the many parishioners who have mentioned its absence to me, are very grateful to Jeff Hunt for his assistance and happy to have our symbol of freedom restored.

This week the syllabus has everyone working on the Easter Lesson, it is the same lesson for all grades. The curriculum is designed so you may go at your own pace, however if your child is in Grade 2 and receiving their First Holy Communion, they need to complete all 20 lessons prior to the reception of the Sacrament. If your child is in any other grade please plan to complete the curriculum by Tuesday, June 15th. If you need help logging onto the online platform please contact the Faith Formation office.

First Holy Communion Retreat videos were emailed to families on Friday, March 19th. Retreat participation can be done on the schedule that best meets your family’s needs. You may choose to watch the videos and complete the activities all at once or you may choose to watch one or two of the videos at a time and work on the activities at your own pace, however please plan to complete the retreat prior to First Communion.

Mass is being offered for our First Holy Communion Children on Sunday, April 18th at 9:30am. We encourage our First Holy Communion Families to either attend in person or to live stream the Mass and watch from home. Fr. Palardy will give a special homily geared toward our First Communicants.

First Holy Communion Mass dates are: Saturday, May 1st at 11:00am and 1:00pm, Sunday, May 2nd at 1:30pm, Saturday, May 8th at 11:00am and at 1:00pm. Music Ministry Notes

The liturgy of Palm Sunday takes us on a journey. At the beginning, we commemorate the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, but the joyful cries of “Hosanna” are quieted by the somber readings. So, too, our

music changes from the exultant “All Glory, Laud and Honor” to the anguished Psalm refrain, “My God, my God, why have You abandoned me?” We reflect on the joy of the crowds on the first Palm Sunday, as well as the grief of the Crucifixion, at this beginning of Holy Week.

We recently learned, to our great joy, that limited congregational singing is now permitted, following all current safety protocols. This means that once again we may lift our voices together in the various acclamations and responses of the Mass, such as the Gospel acclamation, the Eucharistic Acclamations and Lamb of God, and those responses that are unique to Holy Week. We must all keep our masks on, fully covering the mouth and nose, and we won’t be singing hymns together just yet, but this is a welcome step toward full congregational singing once more. Thanks be to God!

In addition, parishes are permitted to have quartets of singers during Holy Week, the Triduum, and Easter, with appropriate COVID safety precautions. At the time of this writing, more than a week before Palm Sunday because of the early bulletin deadline, our junior and adult quartets, cantors, and instrumentalists are preparing for these most solemn celebrations. Our choirs are working to create a recording to be played following our Easter liturgies, and the organ restoration is projected to be completed just before Holy Week begins. Our parish musicians look forward to enhancing the beauty, solemnity and joy of these, our most important liturgical celebrations of the year. Please join in singing with us once more!




