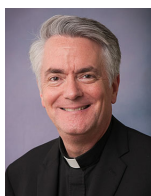

A Note from Our Pastor,

Many thanks to the O'Hanlons and those working with them in organizing our Giving Tree Program this year for families who turn to My Brother's Keeper for assistance. Thanks also to those who have taken ornaments or turkey/meal tickets. There are still many more ornaments for the taking, and the ornaments with the attached gift should be brought to Church NEXT WEEKEND December 11th and 12th at any Mass EXCEPT the 5pm Sunday Mass.

We have a few more Advent booklets entitled *The Fullness of Time* with daily reflections by the late Fr. Henri Nouwen. Also we still have booklets entitled *Jesus, Fill My Heart with Joy* by Kathy Hendricks with prayers and activities appropriate for families with young children.

Supermarket gift cards may be placed in the collection baskets to help those who turn to St. Matthew's Food Pantry in Dorchester for assistance.

A reminder that we have a Coat Drive going on until December 31st, so please drop off gently used adult or youth coats in the boxes at the exits of the Church.

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a Holyday of Obligation, will be celebrated at two Masses this Wednesday December 8th at 9am and 7pm. It is under her title as Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception that our Blessed Mother is Patroness of the United States (and several other countries as well). Remember, there would be no Christmas without Mary, so let's be sure to give Almighty God and the Blessed Virgin the honor that is their due.

Also in our Church Calendar this week on Monday December 6th we celebrate St. Nicholas of Myra (in current-day Turkey) who is the patron saint of more kinds of people and professions than I have space to indicate, as well as of several regions of Europe. But if you read up on him online or in Catholic publications you'll quickly see why this 4th-century bishop is the model of gift-giving and charity to the poor which makes him the original Santa Claus!

On December 7th, while we as a nation recall those members of the US military and the civilians who were killed in the attack on Pearl Harbor on this date in 1941 which propelled the United States to enter the Second World War, we as Catholic Christians commemorate St. Ambrose, another 4th-century bishop, from Milan who was a great teacher, preacher, poet and composer of hymns. Together with St. Monica, St. Ambrose was very instrumental in converting St. Augustine to Catholic Christianity.

On Thursday we honor St. Juan Diego who was a native Mexican in the 16th century who was blessed to be the one to whom Our Blessed Mother appeared as Our Lady of Guadalupe, the Patroness of all the Americas. We don't celebrate her feast day this year because it falls on a Sunday, but in honoring St. Juan Diego we are reminded of the unity we have as Catholic Christians with all our

brothers and sisters in Christ throughout all of North and South America, and especially with those of Native American and Latino/a ethnicity.

On Friday we celebrate a relatively new Feast Day in our part of the world honoring our Blessed Mother under the title of "Our Lady of Loreto". We commemorate the Holy House of Loreto where Mary was born and where the Annunciation occurred, and call to mind the faith and virtues of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and St. Joseph. The House is now located in Loreto, Italy.

On Saturday we remember Pope St. Damasus another 4th century bishop. He did much to build shrines to early Christian martyrs and to foster devotion to these courageous witnesses to Christ. He also encouraged St. Jerome to produce a new translation of the Bible in Latin called the Vulgate to make the Word of God much more accessible for all Christian believers.

Turning to a matter that is anything but saintly, I have been informed that some scammers have hacked into some of our email addresses here at St. Agatha's and have emailed parishioners requesting that they buy gift cards at my request or at the request of other members of our parish staff. Please do not respond if you receive one of these sorts of emails. If I or any of the other staff members have that sort of request to make, we'll either speak to you in person or call you on the phone.

There have been some questions from parishioners about when we'll be getting our 2022 Calendars from Thomas Funeral Home. We have been informed that there is a delay with no exact date given about when they will be arriving. Once we do receive them we'll make them available to you at church.

December 5 ~ Second Sunday of Advent

"Prepare the way of the Lord." This is what the Church calls us to focus on in these opening weeks of Advent. How might we prepare for the coming of Christ now and at the hour of our death? St. Paul offers some ideas for what we need to do. He prays that our love will increase in knowledge and perception, that we will discern what is of value, and that we will live pure and blameless lives. St. Paul encourages us with the reminder that God has already begun this good work in us and will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus. In this coming week, ask for the grace to keep the focus on Christ. Remember, that even in the midst of all that seeks to distract, God is with you.

Read Reflect Respond

THEME: We are getting ready to welcome Christ into our hearts.

As you hear this reading, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart? What lingers in your memory?

Gospel: Luke 3:1–6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert.

John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah:

*A voice of one crying out in the desert:
"Prepare the way of the Lord,
make straight his paths.
Every valley shall be filled
and every mountain and hill shall be made low.
The winding roads shall be made straight,
and the rough ways made smooth,
and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."*

THE WEEKLY UPDATE

We're almost there! The Grand Annual Appeal continues to move along steadily towards our budgeted goal of \$200,000. As contributions are coming in on a daily basis, as of this writing, our current total is \$138,157! Thus far we have had responses from 323 households. If you haven't yet joined in, your help would be greatly appreciated. It would be a huge help if we could exceed our budgeted total as we did last year, because while our current offertory total is above what has been budgeted, our offertory budget has decreased significantly over the years. As always, thank you so much for your generosity!

I also wanted to bring to everybody's attention that there has been a significant software upgrade to our online giving platform, ParishSOFT Giving. I wanted to give all parishioners some quick instructions to ensure that they are able to properly log into their accounts:

When you access your normal online giving platform, "My Own Giving", you will be redirected to the ParishSOFT Giving portal. The first time you visit ParishSOFT Giving, you should choose the "Register a New Account" option, and use the same email address that was used when signing up for "My Own Giving". Using the same email address will associate all of your recurring gifts that were migrated to the new system.

We have received a few notifications that some parishioners were having trouble logging in, so we wanted to make sure that if there are any issues, that we can correct them right away. 2021 Giving Tree Project

St. Agatha Parish and My Brother's Keeper are joining hands for our 30th Annual Giving Tree Project to help families in need throughout the South Shore and beyond. Last year was the most successful yet, as My Brother's Keeper helped 2,760 families in 76 cities and towns. In the last 29 years, you have contributed greatly to the exciting expansion of the ministry of My Brother's Keeper by helping over 2,750 families experience the warmth of friendship and the renewal of hope. With so many families struggling, we hope that this will be the best year ever!

We will again have an opportunity to join our "Helping Hands" with those of My Brother's Keeper as we kick off this year's effort on November 27. Many parishioners have made this a family tradition, and you and your family can join in this rewarding project in a number of ways:

1. **If you would like to sponsor an entire family** – My Brother's Keeper asks that you send an e-mail to sponsor@mybrotherskeeper.org. By doing this, you can request a family whose size and make-up fits your budget and interests. Generally a Sponsor Card is sent to you the same day as your request is received.
2. **If you would prefer to help by buying an individual gift**, "Giving Trees" will be set up before and after each Mass on the weekends of Nov 27 – 28 and Dec 4 - 5 so that you may select an ornament with a child's or parent's name. On each ornament will be the name, age, sex, clothing size, and a suggested gift for the child or parent you will be touching with your generosity. You then purchase and wrap the gift, write on the back of the original ornament what you purchased, and attach it to the package. Then bring the gift with you to any Mass (except the 5:00 PM) on Dec. 11th or 12th. If you would prefer to buy an unwrapped generic gift to help families who make last minute appeals, those are most welcome as well. After the 11:30 Mass on December 12th, volunteers from the parish will help group each family's gifts together for delivery, and the gifts will then be brought to My Brother's Keeper for distribution.
3. **You can also select a "turkey" ornament** which gives instructions for contributing \$10 towards purchasing a turkey or, if your means allow, \$35 to purchase a complete dinner.
4. **Volunteer to help.** If you would like to volunteer to help hand out ornaments before and after Mass on the weekends of Nov 27 - 28 and Dec 4 -5, or with the gift sorting and preparation on Dec 12 at 12:30pm, please email Mike and Gay O'Hanlon at mohanlonuva@gmail.com.

A special way of expressing our gratitude to God for giving us the gift of His Son is to share some of our blessings with those who are less fortunate. After all, He has no hands but ours. 
