



## A Note from Our Pastor,

As most of you are well aware, with the uptick in COVID cases the Archdiocese of Boston has mandated that from now until January 17, 2022 masks must be worn at all public Masses. I don't know too many people who enjoy having

to wear a mask, but given the increase in hospitalizations (over 145% in a month) and crowded churches, we are exercising an "abundance of caution" especially since there are many people celebrating with us who are in and out of the area, vaxed and non-vaxed, booster shot or not. We are so glad you are here! It is very important to respect one another as we pray together. Finally, consider that wearing a mask is not about science or politics, but as Roman Catholics, we are about caring for others! That's who we are! Wearing a mask is an act of charity—a "gift" to one another during this Christmas Season. Thank you for your patience and respect. If you happen to forget to bring a mask with you, we will provide you with one. We just ask that you sanitize your hands before reaching into the box that contains the facemasks. You'll find the masks and sanitizing locations inside the entryways of the church. The only exception is that if you enter by the elevator door, the masks and the sanitizer can be found in the upper church as you enter the door at the top of the stairs.

Once again this year I was so impressed by the large number of gifts that our parishioners donated to needy families who are assisted by My Brother's Keeper, and by the great number of parish volunteers in the School cafeteria who prepared these gifts for delivery under the masterful direction of Michael and Gay O'Hanlon. As we celebrate during this Christmas Season the astounding generosity of God in sending the gift of His Son Jesus to us to be our Savior, a glimpse of that Divine generosity can be found in the generosity of so many of you here at St. Agatha's in your response to human need around us this time of year. Thank you all very much for your generosity.

Please note in our Music Ministry Notes in this bulletin our Music Director Julie Fay's column about the hand chimes that our several choirs are beginning to use. In the early days of the pandemic when singing was not permitted in church, Julie came up with the idea of looking into asking some charitable foundations if they might be interested in providing us with funds to purchase hand chimes to be used at Mass and other occasions by our choirs. One of our parishioners, Patty Bulman, worked with Julie in formulating a proposal to send to some of these foundations to help us in this regard. Well, the Demoulas Foundation acceded to our request and provided us with funding for our new hand chimes. I'm looking forward to hearing the chimes be put to use during this Christmas Season, and when I go grocery shopping, one of the places I'll go will be Market Basket which is a Demoulas enterprise.

On the front page of this bulletin you have likely seen our Mass schedule for Christmas Eve and Day. The 4pm and 6pm Masses on Christmas Eve and the 11am on Christmas Day are being livestreamed. For those who will be participating in Mass via livestream and would like to receive Holy Communion, the priests and deacons will be offering Holy Communion in the parking lot around noontime on Christmas Day—immediately after the 11am Mass.

I want to share with you an excerpt from a homily by the Venerable Bede who was a British monk who lived in the late 7<sup>th</sup> and early 8<sup>th</sup> century. He delivered this homily on Holy Family Sunday and spoke about the Gospel that we hear this Sunday about the 12-year-old Jesus remaining in the Jerusalem Temple much to the chagrin of Mary and St. Joseph. The text of his homily is below, and comes from *Christ Our Light: Patristic Readings on Gospel Themes 1: Advent-Pentecost*, translated and edited by Friends of Henry Ashworth (Riverdale, MD: Exordium Books, 1981), pages 55-57:

[The Gospel] describes the infancy and boyhood of our Redeemer, in which he deigned to become a sharer in our humanity; it recalls the timelessness of the divine majesty, in which he remained, and always will remain, equal to the Father. Clearly this is so that we, having in mind the humility of his incarnation, should set ourselves to learn from it true humility, the cure for the wounds of all sins. We who are dust and ashes should meditate with faithful hearts on how much we ought to humble ourselves, out of love both for God and for our own salvation, when he who is the ultimate power did not disdain to be humbled for us, taking upon himself the imperfection of our frailty.

The fact that at 12 years old he sat in the temple among the doctors, listening and asking questions, is a sign or rather an outstanding example of the humility that we must learn. The fact that as he sat in the temple the Lord said, "I must be about my Father's business," proclaims that his power and glory is co-eternal with that of God his Father. But the fact that he returned to Nazareth and was under the authority of his parents is at once a sign of his true humanity and an example of humility. For it was in his human nature, in which he was less than the Father, that he was subject to human authority.

"And his Mother kept all these things, pondering them in her heart." Everything that she knew to have been said or done by the Lord or concerning him, the Virgin Mother diligently kept in her heart. She committed it all carefully to memory, so that when the time should come for preaching or writing about the Lord's incarnation she could base her explanations to inquirers upon a complete record of his deeds.

Let us too imitate the faithful Mother of the Lord, and repel the invasion of vain and harmful thoughts by imprinting on our hearts every word and deed of our Lord and Savior and meditating on them day and night. For if we wish in the blessed age to come to dwell in the house of the Lord and to praise him forever, we must anticipate in this age, by our frequent visits to the church, what we seek in the age to come; and this not only by singing God's praises in church, but by showing forth in every place where he rules both in words and in deeds, those things that redound to the praise and glory of our Creator.

It is good that after it has been said that "Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature and in favor" there is added "with God and man." Because as by growing in stature he made accessible to men and women the gifts of wisdom and grace that were his; so likewise he tirelessly roused them to the praise of God the Father, carrying out himself what he taught others to do: "Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven."

# Read Reflect Respond

**Gospel:** Luke 2:41-52

Each year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover.

that the Saint Agatha Hand Chime Chorale is making its debut at the 6pm and 11am Masses on Christmas Eve and Day. As Fr. Palardy mentioned in his column, the Hand Chime Chorale was originally conceived as a way to make liturgical music when singing was not permitted due to the pandemic. Thanks to parishioner and choir member Patty Bulman's expertise in grant-writing, and to the generosity of the Demoulas Foundation, we were able to secure a grant this fall to purchase our 3-octave set of hand chimes. Our ringers have been rehearsing twice weekly since before Thanksgiving, learning proper ringing and damping technique, as well as more advanced music-reading and ensemble skills. The use of bells has deep liturgical roots, and we hope the unique sound of hand chimes will help make our Christmas celebrations even more special this year.

Finally, it takes many hands and voices to prepare music for Christmas. A heartfelt thank you to the members of our parish music ministry, who give so generously of themselves in rehearsals and Masses. A special shoutout to the members of our Christmas Festival Choir, who responded to our bulletin invitation and joined us for rehearsals and Christmas Masses. Thank you to all who sang, rang and played the joyful music of Christmas! Our parish is blessed because of you.
