A Note from Our Pastor,

This past Sunday, the Solemnity of Pentecost, I mentioned in my homily at the 5pm Mass that what the Holy Spirit energizes us to do as a church is to reach out and to draw in. That is, we need the Spirit's gifts of courage and wisdom to go out and meet others where they are, and then with kindness and joy—2 of the fruits of the Holy Spirit—we proceed to invite others to join us here in this community of faith. While our parish has fared pretty well during the COVID pandemic, all things considered, it is also evident that the number of those parishioners who worship here every weekend has dwindled a fair bit. We might well be asking ourselves, "What can I do to encourage others, neighbors perhaps, friends and colleagues, or even members of my own family, to come with me to give God the praise that is God's due at a weekend Mass at St. Agatha's?" Well, what can we do to reach out to such folks and draw them in to the regular practice of our Catholic Christian faith? My suggestion is to make the most of a great opportunity we all have to introduce or re-introduce our sisters and brothers in Christ whom we may not see here too often to join us for our Centennial celebration next Saturday June 18th. Our 4:30 Mass that afternoon will focus on 2 realities that should mean a great deal to us all: first the celebration of the Feast of Corpus Christi, in which we can deepen our love and gratitude for the amazing gift of Christ's Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist that we are so blessed to share; and, second, to commemorate once again the profound faith, love, courage, and fidelity that our Patroness St. Agatha had and demonstrated for Jesus Christ, and rejoice that we have such an awe-inspiring role-model and intercessor for us on our journey as disciples of the Lord Jesus ourselves. What makes our Masses next weekend additionally special is that it was 100 years ago on June 19, 1922 that the first Mass was celebrated in St. Agatha Church. To mark this grand event, there will be a party atmosphere after the 4:30 Mass on Saturday. In our front parking lot there will be several food vendors with delicious food for us to savor and also a number of games for the younger members of our parish to play and enjoy. We'll have a wonderful opportunity to spend time with one another, enjoy one another's company, and share a meal together, as well as participate in some fun and games. By inviting neighbors, family members, and friends to come and join in the festivities, you'll make it possible for them to realize what a great community of folks we have here at St. Agatha Parish, relax and enjoy the food and party atmosphere, and thereby you'll help plant the seed in their hearts for them to consider seriously returning here to worship with us on a more regular basis. While all are most welcome, we ask those who know that they are coming

to RSVP on the Centennial page on our parish website. We certainly will not be turning anyone away, but by giving us your RSVP, it will help us in planning the logistics of the Saturday event. People are also welcome to come to our outdoor celebration on Saturday, and then come back for one of the Sunday Masses the next day. That will be a fine way to celebrate Fathers' Day as well. The one other request I'd make is for us all to pray that the weather co-operates. We are blessed to have our Parish Center (a.k.a. the Gym) in the event of inclement weather, but being outside enjoying the food, activities, and one another's company will be much more enjoyable if the sun is shining. May our prayers and St. Agatha's intercession give us a beautiful day next Saturday! Speaking for myself, I can hardly wait! In the meantime, have a blessed week.

We proclaim the Most Holy Trinity as a mystery of our faith. It is central to our Christian faith and life. The doctrine of the Trinity includes the truth that there are three persons in One God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. While we will never fully understand this mystery in our lifetime, the creed we profess at Mass is an invitation to an even deeper understanding of who God is and desires to be for us. The Sign of the Cross and the doxology or "Glory be ..." are two prayers that are easy to say. Use those prayers this week, and as you do so, ask the Holy Spirit to increase your faith in the Trinity.

Registration for the 2022-2023 Faith Formation Year is now open!!

Families currently enrolled in the program received an email on June 1 containing the link to the online registration form. The registration link can also be found on the St. Agatha Parish website.

The Faith Formation Program is an at-home online program supplemented with optional in-person family faith-sharing gatherings.

The online lessons can be accessed by any device that connects to the internet. They are fun and engaging, featuring an on-screen catechist that guides the children through their lessons. Accompanying materials allow families the opportunity to expand their at-home learning.

Optional in-person family gatherings, called BELIEVE Sessions, will be held on select Wednesday afternoons from 4:00–5:00 pm and Sunday mornings following the 9:30 am Family Mass. The BELIEVE Sessions foster community and faith sharing.

The preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion **is a two-year process** generally in grades 1 and 2. **If your child is beyond Grade 2** please contact the Faith Formation Office to discuss proper placement in the program.


