Does St. Agatha's Have a Library?

Yes, our parish community is very fortunate in that we have a very fine library with a wide-ranging selection. The library is located just as you leave the Gathering Space, signed Parish Meeting Room and Resource Room. During Covid, our library was not much used, and many in our community either have forgotten about its existence or didn't know we had one.

The selection includes much more than "spiritual reading." We have commentaries on all of the Sacred Scripture, Hebrew and Christian. The lives of the saints and many other biographies are arranged alphabetically by name. There are practical guides for life, written by thoughtful women and men, to guide us on our journeys.

Moreover, the selection is "ecumenical" in many senses of that word. First, we have books from many traditions, Christian and Jewish. For example, C.S. Lewis, the great Anglican author, is represented, as are authors from the Eastern Orthodox tradition. Beyond that, there are several genres. Biography, of course, but history, fiction and poetry can be found in our library. An assortment of "self-help" material is also available. There is a wonderful selection of art collections that remind us of Dorothy Day's biography, *The World Will be Saved by Beauty* (available in our library).

The library, as with all libraries now, has an audio-video section. There are several movies as well as instructional videos, most in DVDs but some on VHS tapes. There is also an audio-selection, again in mixed formats. All of this is "inspirational," even if not specifically religious. My recommendation: if you haven't seen *A Man for All Seasons* (the magnificent movie about St. Thomas More), borrow it before someone else does.

There is also a fine, but small, selection of children's books. Again, not all are religious, but these are books that children can profit from. These books are located on lower shelves under the audio-visual section.

Perhaps not everyone will be familiar with the classification system. Most local libraries use the Dewey Decimal system, but our library is classified according to the Library of Congress system. This is the system used in academic institutions, but also by other major libraries. There are "signposts" indicating the main subject areas, and the system is easy to use. However, not all books have been classified, particularly the biographical shelves, but all of the sections are marked with an encased card indicating the topic of the books above.

How do you take out a book?

There is a sign-out binder on the cart, and when someone takes out a book, they sign it out with their name, phone number (optional), and the date. When they return the book, they cross out their name. Books can be taken out

for as long as they are needed, but remember, they belong back in the library at some point.

If you are in doubt, you can always ask someone who is familiar with the library how to go about using it. (As a choir member, I am usually available after the 11:30 Eucharistic Liturgy.)

Do you want to help?

Because of Covid, we have received a number of donations that have to be sorted, classified and shelved. If you have the time to help, leave a note in an envelope in the library. You do not have to have librarian experience.

We also accept donations of appropriate material, not only books but also audio-visual. Books (but not pamphlets) on pilgrimage sites are also accepted.

Remember: This is a resource for all of our community and we can use whatever is available in every media and for every age-group. Don't hesitate to explore and find what interests you.

February 12 ~ Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time


Today’s readings focus our attention on the effect our choices have on ourselves and others. Observing God’s law does have positive effects on our own lives, as well as on the lives of those around us. We may not think people pay much attention to what we say or do, that we are not that important, but Jesus clearly knows a lot more about the ways of human nature. Jesus makes clear in today’s gospel, “whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments **and** teaches others to do so will be called least in the kingdom of heaven.” Stop and listen to your spouse or your children, or a family member or friend. Do you hear them express your patience or your impatience, your compassion or your intolerance, your angry language or your temperate speech? Ask Christ for the grace to set a good example to everyone in your life. Your choices will lead to everlasting life!
