A Note from Our Pastor,

For my column this weekend, I want to call your attention to three items. First, the return of our teens and their chaperones on Saturday July 1st from their Appalachian Service Trip to West Virginia. All were very happy to have

returned home, but also I perceived a great sense of satisfaction from the teens and the chaperones alike, knowing that their hard work in repairing homes was gratefully received by the families who dwelt therein. I also sensed that a great bond was forged between the adult chaperones and the teens. Many of the adults mentioned to me how impressed they were with the attitude and the work ethic of the teens. From them all I noted an appreciation both for having the opportunity to work together in improving the well-being of those they served, and for the blessings they enjoy in their lives here in Milton and Quincy. It needs also to be noted that these young people are attentive to caring for the needs of poor people locally, through their efforts in making sandwiches for Father Bill's Place and Mainspring, and in supporting Interfaith Social Services. Kudos to our Youth Minister Helen Waring and to the adults and youth who work with her in their outreach to the needs of those both near and far.

The second item has been mentioned in the announcements at the weekend Masses the past couple of weeks. We want to start up again in September the monthly Family Coffee Hour after the 9:30am Sunday Mass on the first Sunday of each month, but to do so we need volunteers. You'll find in this bulletin a description of the details of what is involved in these Family Coffee hours. 

Gospel: Mt 13:1-9

On that day, Jesus went out of the house and sat down

by the sea.

Pastoral Planning July 16 ~ Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our readings present the image of the Word of God being sown as seeds upon field. "A sower went out to sow..." Listen to these readings with the mind and heart of an evangelizer. Is the soil of your soul receptive to the word of God that you hear? Do you believe that with God's grace, your words and action can bear fruit and bring someone closer to Jesus? Try to find ten minutes each day to read some Scripture. As you do that, pray that the seed of God's word will bear fruit within you.

OPERATIONS UPDATE

I hope that everybody has been enjoying the summer so far and had a great Fourth of July celebration!

I wanted to let everybody know that we will be starting our sound renovation project at the church in the next few weeks. There may be some changes as far as where daily Masses will be held due to the construction, but that information will be provided in the bulletin once we get a more accurate timeline from the vendor on when the materials will arrive. These new changes will provide us with a state of the art sound and projection system that will be a major improvement to the speaker system that we are currently utilizing. Big thanks to Steve Wessling for his expertise and diligence in getting us the proper vendor with fair costs for this project, as well as the Finance Council in approving this project. In addition to the previously mentioned roof replacement and window repairs at the school, this will be a busy summer at the Parish.

Please see the offertory numbers below for the last two weeks. In accordance with how last year's Offertory trended downward, our budgeted number for our Offertory was lowered by about \$50K. We do appreciate any donations made as the Offertory collections are vital to manage our day-to-day expenses, and without them, we would not be able to provide all the services we currently provide for our parishioners at the level that we currently do.



Welcome to Gregg Chambers Saint Agatha School's Newly Appointed Principal

Gregg Chambers is an Elementary and Middle School instructional leader who has had multiple experiences in education and beyond that have led to his appointment as



Principal of Saint Agatha School. Most recently, Gregg was the Assistant Principal & Director of the Middle School at Saint Catherine of Siena School (SCS) in Norwood, MA. Saint Catherine of Siena School serves over 400 students from Norwood and twenty surrounding communities. In this role, he was primarily responsible for the oversight of the Middle School with a focus on developing faculty capacity to deliver authentic, meaningful instruction to improve student academic outcomes across the curriculum. Gregg was also responsible for leadership of the whole school (PS-8) in partnership with and guidance from the school's Principal. Prior to becoming an administrator, Gregg was a Math & Science teacher at SCS Middle School and the Chair of the school's Math Curriculum Committee, which oversaw the horizontal and vertical alignment of the Zearn Math curriculum across Grades K-8. He also brings multiple years of instructional experience from his time working in the Dover-Sherborn Public Schools and Westford Public Schools. Furthermore, Gregg was a Fundraising and Administrative Leader during a twentythree year career serving Catholic Schools, independent schools, non-profit organizations, and a local college prior to becoming an educator.

Gregg holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Finance from Boston College, an MBA from Babson College, and a Post-Baccalaureate Teacher Licensure certification from Framingham State University. Gregg also recently completed a year long fellowship in Cohort XII of the Lynch Leadership Academy (LLA) at Boston College during the 2022-2023 academic year. LLA supports sitting principals and aspiring principals from district, charter, Catholic, and independent schools in acquiring educational and executive leadership skills and in building a network that confronts urgent issues facing urban education. Gregg has his Principal licensure from the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE),

Gregg and his wife Kim live in Needham, MA, where they are parishioners at Saint Joseph Parish, and have been married for nearly twenty-eight years. They have two adult children, Brendan and Claire.


