

### October 8 ~ Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God." Once again, St. Paul is direct in his teaching which is so relevant as we strive to live as faith-filled disciples in a world that promotes attitudes that are counter to the way Christ calls us to live! Establishing a pattern of daily prayer, even if only ten minutes a day, gives us a greater ability to face life's anxieties and difficulties. We also need to give thanks for the good things that may be overlooked. St. Paul knows the fruit that is borne from prayer, "Then the God of peace will be with you." How might you pass this simple practice of daily prayer to another so that they might come to know God's peace?

### A Note from Our Pastor,

Inasmuch as I won't be preaching at the Masses this weekend, I did want to share with you some thoughts about the Word of God that we'll hear at the weekend Masses, as well as other Scriptural texts that I thought would be informative for us.

"Use it or lose it!"—this is a proverb worth remembering. Years ago when I taught Ecclesiastical Latin to seminarians who were in St. Clement's Seminary College at St. John's Seminary in Brighton, I often encouraged the seminarians to pick up a copy of the Bible in Latin and every day read from that Bible the Gospel for Mass so that they wouldn't lose their facility in the language they've spent so much time and energy in mastering, once their formal course work was over. If they don't continue to use the language they've learnt, they'll lose it. So, use it or lose it. Or for people getting along in years, if they don't get enough exercise or do some walking, they'll likely lose some mobility and find getting around even more difficult. "Use it or lose it." Well, God's word to us today gives a similar message. If we don't make good use of the blessings entrusted to us by God, we'll lose these blessings—and in fact, they'll be taken away from us and given to others. Use it or lose it; produce or perish these are proverbs containing a good bit of common sense.

The prophet Isaiah criticizes the people of Judah and Jerusalem for failing to produce the justice, righteousness, and holiness that God demanded of them. Like a vineyard master who expends time, effort, energy, and resources in caring for his vineyard only to have it yield wild grapes which were good for nothing, God gave so much to His chosen people—delivering them from slavery in Egypt, providing them with food and drink while they wandered in the desert, making them victorious in battles with their enemies, giving them a land in which to live, and commands by which to direct their lives—God did all this and much more besides—only to have His people fail to return His love and care by turning to worship foreign gods and selfishly amassing wealth while neglecting to care for the needy and downtrodden right in their very midst. They failed to produce good fruit, despite all of the attention and effort God had lavished upon them. For such a failure, God threatens to deprive them of their privileged place in His sight.

According to Matthew the Evangelist, Jesus uses the same example of the vineyard, but this time the emphasis is on the tenant farmers who work the vineyard. In this parable it's not the grapes of the vineyard, but the workers of the vineyard who have turned sour. The tenant farmers acted violently against the servants and even the son of the landlord and ended up being replaced by more reputable employees. Like those tenant farmers, the religious leaders of Jesus' day had failed to cultivate and care for the people entrusted to their care by God,

and indeed had treated God's messengers, the prophets, badly and would even put Jesus, God's own Son, to death. As a result, Jesus says, "The kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit."

My friends, you and I are that new people that God expects to produce good fruit. To use the image of St. Paul in the Letter to the Romans, God has grafted us on to the fertile olive tree of Israel. How blessed we are as Catholics to have solid Jewish roots. The people of Israel were the first to hear the word of God, they produced men and women outstanding in holiness and faith—people like Abraham and Sarah, Moses and Deborah, Ruth and Elijah. Thanks to the Jewish people we have the books of our Old Testament, a moral code in the 10 Commandments, and a Savior Jesus Christ the Jewish child of a Jewish Mother, and we call Him the Son of God and the Savior of the world. How blessed we are to be given a share in that glorious Jewish heritage.

And how many other blessings are ours as well!—we can call God our Father and confidently approach God in prayer, we can read God's word to us in the Scripture, we can find guidance and direction in our lives also from the preaching and example of Jesus Christ and from the moral teaching of our church. We don't have to fend for ourselves as isolated individuals, but are provided with strength and support from our sisters and brothers in the community of the church. God's own loving presence and power are constantly available to us in the church's sacramental life—new life in Christ in baptism, the gift of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation, mercy and healing in the Sacraments of Penance and the Anointing of the Sick, and the very Body of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. But these blessings are ours, not so that we might sit back on our laurels and congratulate ourselves. No. as the Scriptures today very strongly warn us—God looks at all the blessings we've received and expects us to yield a rich harvest, to bear abundant fruit.

In his letter to the Galatians St. Paul gives us an idea of the kind of harvest God expects, of the kind of good fruit God wants us to yield: The effects of God's presence in our lives, the result of all God's efforts in our regard are the fruits of the Holy Spirit which include charity, joy, peace, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. God has given each of us so much and will continue to pour out His loving mercy and grace on those who call upon Him. Each one of us is in partnership with Jesus Christ to whom we have been joined from the moment of our baptism, but this earthly life of ours, yours and mine, has an expiration date known only to God. Let's use it, and not lose it; let's produce, and not perish.

#### Adoration at St. Agatha Parish

There is Adoration in the Chapel on Fridays following the 9:00am Mass, from approximately 9:30am-1:00pm as well as Wednesday evenings from 6:30–8:00pm.



Boys and girls of all ages are invited to register for St. Agatha Parish Basketball. Sign ups for the In-House League are done solely online on the parish website. Registration for the league is now open. Registration will close when the maximum number of players has been reached. The link is available on the parish home page (www.stagathaparish.org) or click *here* if reading this bulletin online.

The basketball program is open to all parishioners as well as students of St. Agatha School. The program is divided into age groups ranging from Pee-Wee (Grades K-2)

and going all the way through Grade 8. The In-House program runs all day on Saturday and on Sunday afternoons. The fee is \$90 per child with a maximum of \$180 per family. The fee will include a new tee-shirt. The In-House League season starts on November 4<sup>th</sup> for all age groups and ends on February 11<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

The **Travel League** registration is also done online. The Travel program is divided into age groups from Grade 3 through Grade 12. Registration for the Travel League is now open and will end on October 16th. The Travel League season starts on November 30<sup>th</sup> and ends in March/April, 2024. Try-outs for the Travel League will take place on November 2<sup>nd</sup> from 6-9pm and November 5<sup>th</sup> from 2-8pm. The registration fee for the Travel League will be \$200 per player. New uniforms are not included in the registration fee but you may purchase one when you register for \$60 per uniform.

Our goal is to teach basketball skills in a fun and safe environment while learning to compete with good sportsmanship. The program has been extremely popular in the past, and the capacity at some grade levels has been reached quickly. It will be important to sign up as early as you can to ensure availability, as late registrations will only be accepted on a space available basis. There will be a late fee of \$15 for any late registrations.

We are also in need of volunteers to help coordinate the program and coach our many in-house and travel teams. The program has served nearly 500 youngsters in past years, but we are only able to do this with the help of many great people that are willing to share their time to help form our youth. If you are a parent of a child that is signing up for the program, there will be an option to select on the online registration form if you are interested in coaching/volunteering. A member of our Sports Advisory Board will then be contacting you with more information. There will be a CORI/training meeting on October 17th from 6-8pm in the Gym for all volunteers. 


