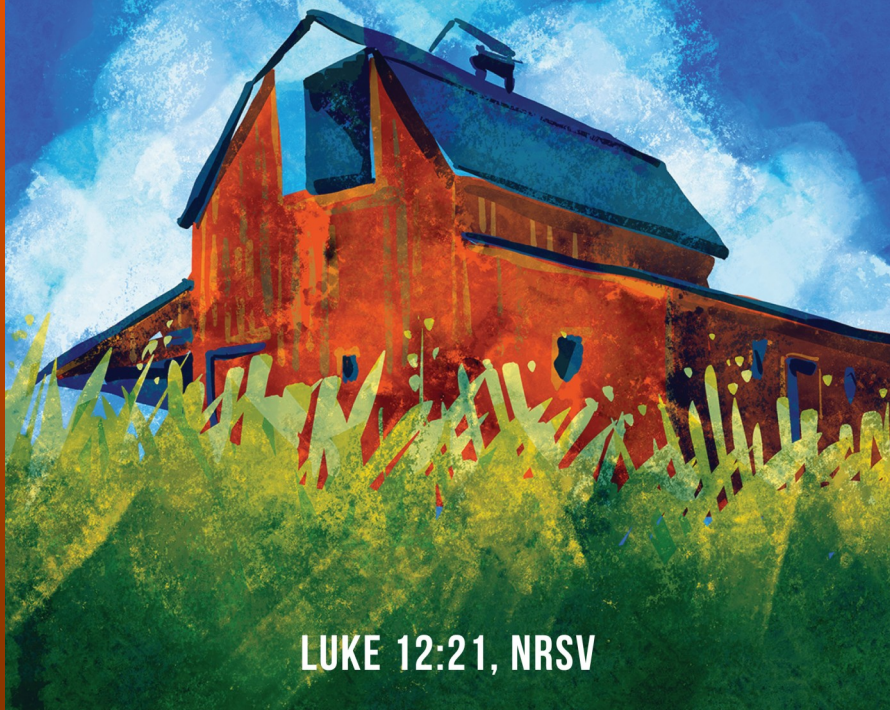

**A Note from Our Pastor,**

As you may know, devastating floods in over twenty counties in Texas have brought enormous destruction and a great loss of life. The floods have killed 135 people with the expectation that number could increase.

Three people are still missing, down from nearly 100 over a week ago. The Guadalupe River rose some 26 feet in 45 minutes and resulted in the deaths of at least 27 children and camp counselors from Camp Mystic, a girls' summer camp. This was part of a large weather system that impacted most severely Texas as well as the southwest.

Recognizing the immediate and growing needs, Catholic Charities USA is seeking assistance for relief efforts in response to the floods. In the spirit of solidarity, Archbishop Henning is asking pastors to voluntarily consider a special collection to support Catholic Charities relief efforts. **There will be baskets at the church entrances where you may drop your free will offering.** Parishes may lend support with prayers and special intentions for overcoming this immense challenge. We were encouraged to hold the collection at our discretion during July and August 2025. Saint Agatha Parish is holding our collection this weekend, August 2–3.

If you would like to contribute, please address your checks to Saint Agatha Parish, with "Texas Flood Relief" in the memo. One check will be sent from the parish, payable to the Archdiocese of Boston. The Archdiocese will then send 100% of your donations to Catholic Charities USA.

The people are suffering in Texas. It is anticipated that local Catholic Charities will experience a strain on their resources. We appreciate your prayers and any contribution you are able to make towards this relief effort.

OPERATIONS UPDATE

As discussed with the Building Committee, the Fire Department Construction Project has been progressing steadily since the July 4th holiday. Over the past few weeks, significant site preparation has taken place, most notably the installation of the subsurface stormwater retention system at the rear of the fire station property.

The next phase, currently being coordinated with the project management team, involves connecting the new building and the Rectory to the town sewer system. Please note that this work will require temporary adjustments to the Rectory’s business hours. Any changes will be posted on the parish website for your convenience. Please note this will not affect the Church or Mass schedule.
