**A Note from the Principal,**

I am pleased to share an update on the ongoing partnership between Saint Agatha Parish and the Saint Agatha School community. These collaborations continue to enrich the spiritual, academic, and communal life of our students and families.

Fr. Brian and Fr. Murphy remain a warm and welcoming presence in the school each day, greeting students and families each morning. Fr. Brian also assists with morning traffic, helping to ensure safety while building strong relationships with parents and families. He has been a valued partner in supporting families as they seek to deepen their connection to the Catholic faith. Fr. Murphy has further enriched our community by serving as a guest lecturer for students in grades 6–8, engaging them in theological discussions aligned with their curriculum.

The Parish Committees and Councils have been very supportive of our work at the School. The Social Committee was instrumental in the success of Grandparents and Special Friends Day on November 24, 2025, supporting an event that welcomed nearly 400 guests. It generously donated proceeds from the Spring 2025 Danny Gill concert toward Phase One of the Saint Agatha Parish Center revitalization. The Spiritual Planning Committee connected with the school on an upcoming Saint Carlo Acutis exhibit. The Finance Council has been very helpful in guiding me on the financial direction of the School. Finally, the Parish Council served in November 2025 as a sounding board on the school's 2025–2028 Strategic Plan.

We are deeply thankful for this strong and meaningful partnership.

Pastoral Planning

February 1 ~ Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our gospel today presents the beatitudes. In them, Jesus describes a way of living or what we might call a beatitude spirit. To those caught up in worldly values, or overwhelmed with circumstances that seem beyond control, these beatitudes can appear unrealistic or of little relevance to our lives. However, we can offer mercy, or be a peacemaker, or live a chaste and pure life or withstand insult because of our faith and love of Christ—we need to imitate Christ whose very life exemplified each of the beatitudes. This week, ask for the grace to be open to making the beatitudes the way you live your discipleship.
